

INFORMATION RE: FACULTY COMPUTERS

In 1985, the college arranged for 9 faculty members to purchase computers through a leasing arrangement. The college paid for 50% of the monthly lease, the instructor paid 50%. The instructor signed a charitable donation agreement for the college to deduct \$50/month from payroll checks over a 4 year period. Maintenance, repairs and insurance are the responsibility of the instructor. The agreement also includes a "buy out" option.

This year, we have \$6000 in the budget to again purchase faculty computers. A lease arrangement will allow more people to participate. As of now, we have applications from 16 individuals and not all requests will be fulfilled.

It is the responsibility of the individual faculty member to decide what they want the computer to do, what software is necessary, and what hardware is needed to run their materials (software was not included in the last leasing arrangement).

Please do not expect other Concordia faculty or staff to tell you what to buy, to choose the correct hardware, or to visit computer stores to get prices.

Since current applicants are requesting different systems, instructors will have to supply requisition data: model numbers, prices, quotes from vendors.

I am reviewing the applications and discussing financial arrangements with Ruth Mathes. We hope to have information soon about how many faculty members will be able to get computers this year.

Your patience and cooperation is much appreciated.


