Budget Steering Committee Begins Work

A Budget Steering Committee consisting of Cabinet members, the Dean of Business Affairs/ Comptroller, and chairpersons of the faculty personnel and support staff committees met on February 13th to establish guidelines and procedures for the 1991-92 budget balancing process. The Steering Committee expects to receive a preliminary draft of the budget by the middle of next week.

A Budget Forum is planned for late March/early April when the Committee will be in a better position to provide more definitive information and answer questions from members of the campus community about the process.

The Steering Committee is open to suggestions you may have for conducting the budget process.

Each candidate has been asked to give a 15-20 minute presentation on the topic "Philosophy of Leadership" to an assembly of interested faculty, students and staff. Lunch with a representative group of the campus community, campus tours, and an interview with the Presidential Search Committee are included in the schedule. Additional time will be made available for students and faculty members to meet with nominees.

Born in Melville, Saskatchewan; married to Valerie nee Hergesheimer whose father served in the ministry in Western Canada for many years. M.Div. from Concordia Seminary, Springfield; Ph.D. in Ed. Admin. from The University of Michigan. Employed at Concordia College, Ann Arbor since 1965; currently Professor in Sociology and Director of Human Resources Administration Program. The latter involves administration of everyday challenges and promotion of an adult degreecompletion program. Presently serves on the Academic Planning Council responsible for five and ten year planning for Concordia, Ann Arbor. Since 1985 has served as Assistant to the Pastor of Historic Trinity Lutheran Church in Detroit.

- 3. To explore whether waste reduction measures currently in place or proposed will be effective in mitigating the waste management problem
- 4. To explore what kinds of health risks are associated with waste management (at both sanitary and hazardous waste sites)
