

School trains young people for future work in church

Concordia is a small Lutheran school that offers a high school matriculation program and first year university.

Situated on Ada Boulevard, it has been in operation since 1921. The main purpose of Concordia is to train young people for future work in the Lutheran Church. Students who don't plan to work for the Church are also accepted.

This year Concordia has a record attendance of 190, with 72 in university and 118 in high school. The school is co-ed and there are 52 girls and 47 men living in the dorms on campus. There are students

from over Canada as well as some from Hong Kong and the United States.

Athletics are also important at Concordia. There are inter-scholastic teams in hockey, basketball, and baseball. There is also an excellent intramural program. The high school basketball teams won't be playing till after Christmas, but they are practising hard and will play a few exhibition games before then.
