

### BOARD OF REGENTS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following does not constitute the minutes of the Board of Regents meeting held on February 26, 1988, but gives highlights of Board action:

- 1. Appointed Mr. Elmer Haberstock of Yorkton, Saskatchewan, as a member of the Board of Regents, to fill the unexpired term of former Regent Arnold Dyke.
- Approved <u>Faculty Handbook</u> policies 3.257 (Revision of Faculty Personnel Committee membership), 4.256 (Leave of Absence - Adoption Leave), and 4.104 (Use of Sessional Instructors), as recommended by the faculty.
- 3. Selected Rev. Carl O. Beiderwieden from Abbotsford, B.C., to receive the Christo Et Ecclesiae Award, and Rev. Fred Stark of Calgary to receive the Distinguished Service Award.
- 4. Received reports from the President, Dean of Development, and Dean of Business Affairs.
- 5. Adopted a revised 1987-1988 balanced budget, as recommended by the Board of Regents Finance Committee.
- 6. Authorized the first phase of Together in Ministry, a joint Concordia College -Concordia Lutheran Seminary program to raise \$2 million each for capital purposes at the institutions. Funds gathered through Together in Ministry, Phase 1, are to be utilized for: construction of a student quadrangle, to include classrooms and a prayer chapel; electrical/mechanical upgrade of Schwermann Hall; construction of a greenhouse; and some landscaping and parking.
- 7. Asked the President to bring a recommendation for an architect to be employed for Phase I of the proposed building plan, for consideration at the next Board of Regents meeting.
- 8. Received information that the terms of current Board of Regents members will be extended through December 31, 1988, and that newly elected Board of Regents members will begin terms on January 1, 1989, at the time that The Lutheran Church-Canada officially begins operation.
- 9. Received a report on the Lutheran Historical Institute.
- 10. Under personnel, took the following action: a) approved position descriptions for the Career Development Institute Secretary, Science Laboratory Coordinators, and the Director of Communications; b) accepted the resignation of Professor Scott Hafso from the High School faculty; c) granted a special study leave to Professor Lowell Eckert for second semester of the 1988–1989 academic year for advanced doctoral work; d) called Professor Harald Tomesch as Visiting Instructor of Religious Studies, and e) made the following administrative appointments for first semester of the 1988–1989 academic year while the President is on sabbatical leave: i) Dr. Judith Meier, Vice-President (Academic) with responsibility for academic affairs, high school program, admissions and registrar's areas, and continuing education; ii) Professor Richard Kraemer, Vice-President (Campus Life, Finance) with responsibility for student affairs, development and communications, and finances; iii) Professor Lowell Eckert, Assistant Dean of Academic Affairs, and iv) the President will continue, on a minimal basis, carrying out external contacts with the Church-at-large and government.
- 11. Set future Board of Regents meetings for June 3, 1988; August 26, 1988; and November 25, 1988.





#### GUEST LECTURER

Dr. John Ekstedt will be on Concordia's campus on Friday, March 11, to deliver a lecture on Canada's correctional policy. Dr. Ekstedt is a faculty member at Simon Fraser University and will be in Edmonton as the keynote speaker at the Corrections Conference to be held at Grant MacEwan Community College.

Dr. Ekstedt has held positions with the British Columbia Corrections Department as Executive Director, Planning and Development, and with the Ministry of the Attorney General as Executive Director, Planning Development, Corrections Branch; Executive Director and Vice-Chairman, Justice Development Commission; Deputy Minister and Commissioner of Corrections; Acting Deputy Attorney General; and Senior Policy Advisor.

Dr. Ekstedt is holder of the Martin Luther King Memorial Award (1971) and the Governor General's Award, Canadian Silver Jubilee Medal (1977), and is a former Lutheran pastor.


## FACULTY OF MEDICINE OPEN HOUSE
