JOB ENTRY PROJECT

Braemar Campus is hosting a new project designed to assist young people in their attempts to enter the labor market. Career Development Institute staff are working with staff from Harcourt, Matthews and Associates Ltd. to provide career counselling and instructional components for the project. The CDI component is an integral part of the program. It includes:

1. Career planning
2. Self-esteem and assertiveness
3. Communications skills
4. Job search and maintenance skills

The program began on February 8 and will continue until the end of August, 1988. It's the second exemplar project undertaken by the Career Development Institute.

The project will feature an integrated co-operative work experience component to begin in March. Each participant will be provided with a number of opportunities to gain valuable work experience during this phase of the program.

CHOIR SINGS "FAREWELL" TO MISSOURI SYNOD

NEWS FROM BRAEMAR

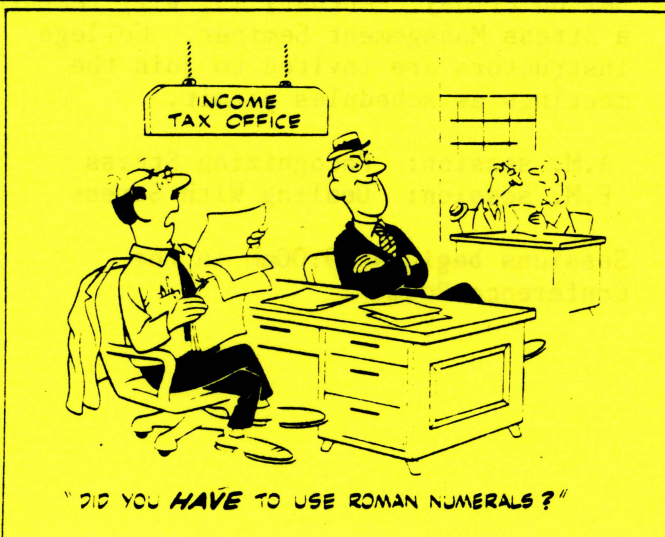

Bring one main course dish, plus a salad or dessert.

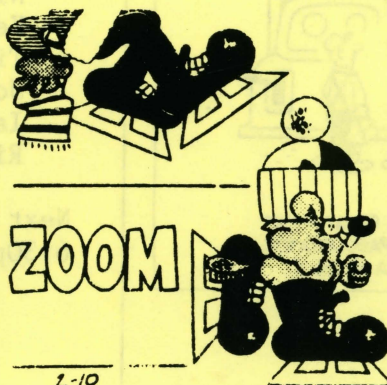

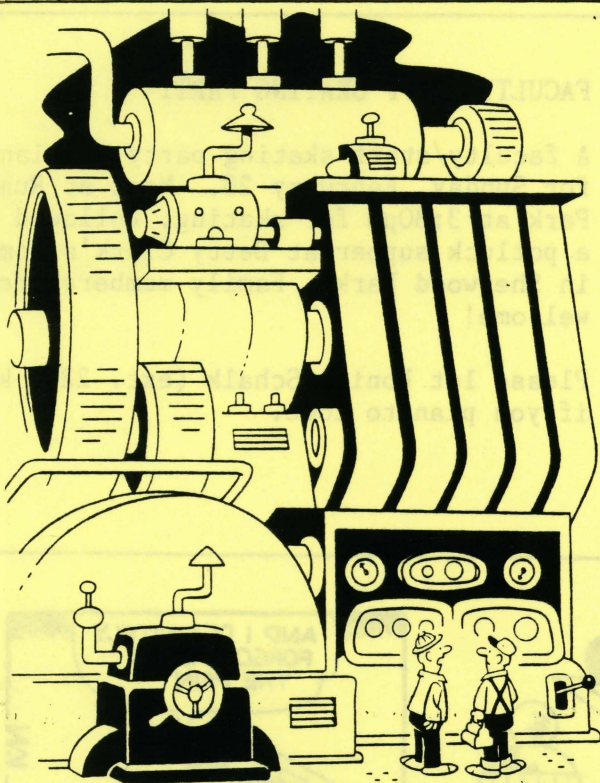
