Concordia Bursary Assistance

Concordia Bursary Program

Students experiencing financial difficulties while attending Concordia may apply for bursary assistance. A Concordia bursary is nonrepayable financial assistance awarded to domestic and international students on the basis of financial need. Students are expected to make plans for funding their education through primary sources such as personal and family savings, scholarships and awards, and employment earnings. A bursary is meant to supplement, not replace, other financial assistance. The program is funded by both Concordia University College and private donors.

Am I eligible?

Demonstrate financial need based on a modest standard of living Be enrolled in an undergraduate degree program

Be registered full-time (minimum 60% of a full-course load) Have achieved satisfactory academic standing on their most recent course work

Have not previously declared bankruptcy or defaulted on a student loan, including the Concordia Emergency Loan

Application Process

To apply for bursary assistance, students must complete and submit an online application form by the October 15th deadline. In addition, students must submit all supporting documentation to the Student and Enrolment Services office by the deadline. Go to **Services for Students** on the Concordia website and click on "Online Award Applications".

HOW TO REINSTATE INTEREST-FREE STATUS ON STUDENT LOANS

If you have student loans from a previous academic year, each year it is your responsibility to let your lenders know that you are a fulltime student in order to reinstate interest-free status. Students who remember to notify their lenders (National Student Loan Service Centre and Edulinx for Alberta students) before their 6 month grace period expires, will have their loans put back into interest-free status. You can reinstate in one of two ways:

Method 1: Cash a new student loan document (that's when you take the loan certificate to the post office to process it) before the 6 month grace period expires.

Method 2: Complete and submit Reinstatement of Interest Free Status forms - Schedule 2 (for Canada Student Loans) and Form B (for Alberta Student Loans) before the 6 month grace period expires. If you are not receiving a new student loan or have applied for funding late, you will want to complete this paper work so that you do not end up in repayment by accident. For out of province student loans, ask us for the correct form.
