From the Minutes of the Cabinet and Councils

The first Enrollment Management Task Force meeting will be held on Saturday, January 12, from 8:30am to 4:00pm, with about fifty faculty, staff and students participating.

Telephone answering service systems continue to be investigated. Registar and Admissions areas are particularly anxious to find the right kind of message service to meet their needs.

At the suggestion of the FPC, a team consisting of Cabinet members (President, three Vice-Presidents), the Comptroller, the Chairman of the FPC and a representative of the Support Staff Committee will be involved in the final budget balancing process this year.

The Student Services Council has recommended a locker charge of \$20.00 per student per semester as a means of ensuring that students who really need lockers are the ones who get them. This fee could be recommended to the Board of Regents during the budget process this spring.

The Admissions area will be adopting a new approach that will separate the college calendar into two publications this year: 1) a catalogue for students listing courses/instructors (published inhouse), and 2) a glossy viewbook filled with information about the College—to be used as a recruitment tool. The department believes that these two publications will prove more useful to students, and will also result in significant cost savings.

Opportunities for Students

A planning meeting for an apologetics (rational defense of the faith) discussion group is scheduled for Saturday morning – 10am until noon in Room 222 – under the leadership of Dr. Gary Colwell. He will also serve as discussion facilitator for the participating students.
