# Kraemer Elected President of Concordia College!

On April 18, 1991, a call to the presidency of Concordia College was extended by the Board of Regents to Prof. Richard W. Kraemer, who has held the position of Interim President since July 1, 1990. A response to the call is expected by the end of next week.

An alumnus of Valparaiso University in Indiana, Cambridge University in England, and Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Prof. Kraemer has served as a faculty member and administrator at Concordia since 1977. Richard and his wife, Janet, have three children. Jonathan and Cheryl are college students at Concordia; Rebekah attends a local junior high school.

The election climaxes a search process that began last fall. In addition to Richard Kraemer, the slate of candidates considered by the electors consisted of Dr. Paul O. Marschke of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and Dr. Roland E. Miller of Regina, Sask.

"I am deeply honored that I have been asked to serve as President of Concordia College, and I invite the prayers of our constituency and the campus community as I consider the call I have been given," responded Kraemer.

### Cosmopolitan Music Society Spring Concert



- Students will be seated in the first three centre rows of the Auditorium. Faculty will be seated in the section in front of the organ. (Back-up plans are in place to seat the faculty on the stage if guest numbers make this a necessity.)
- 4. MALE participants will remove their mortar boards immediately after taking their places, and will put them on again as the recessional begins. The recessional follows the same order as the processional.

### **Highlights from Cabinet Meetings**

A Staff Officer Handbook Committee has been appointed to develop a Handbook and salary grids for staff officers and non-academic administrators. The committee consists of Ed Klarenbach (Chairman), Gail Gilbert, Judy Kruse, and Mircea Panciuk.

A preliminary report from the Enrollment Management Task Force was presented to the Cabinet by Sheri Dalton (Chair) on April 24th. The committees which comprise the Task Force have been concentrating primarily on the identification of "short term" concerns—issues which are easily described and can be dealt with simply and with minimum expenditure of funds. Suggestions submitted by the Product Committee involve signage, lockers in Guild Hall, student noise in hallways, general cleanliness, and parking. The committees have also started identifying and investigating "long term" concerns.

The 1991–92 budget is nearing a balanced position following an all-day meeting of the Budget Steering Committee on Saturday, April 13th. Meetings with area staff were scheduled throughout that day to assist in the process. The next meeting of the Steering Committee will be held on Wednesday, May 1.

At the suggestion of the Interim Persident, a review of the use of the term "dean" throughout the administration has been undertaken, with more appropriate titles being considered. For instance, the Development Department has recommended that one dean position be deleted and another retitled "Director of Advancement," with supporting staff identified as "Communications Coordinator," "Church Relations Coordinator," and "Development Coordinator." As well, Cabinet is considering new titles for two vice—presidents: the Advancement and Administrative Services V—P would be known as Vice—President, Finance; the Academic Services V—P would be called Vice—President, Academic. These titles are more in line with those recognized in other institutions and understood by the business community.


The corporate fund-raising campaign for the Robert Tegler Student Centre is being readied for a kick-off in early May. Captains are being identified for the various corporate sectors and team members drafted.

#### **Tribute to Donors**

Donor recognition is acknowledged as an important aspect of fund-raising, and an exciting concept has been created to recognize contributors to the Robert Tegler Student Centre. A design commissioned by a local artist, Wei Yeu, received a very positive response from the Building Committee, and the concept was subsequently approved by the Board of Regents.

The design features a 'grove' of three or four trees that will be 'planted' near the entrance to the Student Centre. Made of steel, the trees will be painted with the same kind of enamel used on airplanes and engraved with the names of donors to the Centre.

While it has not yet been finalized, it is believed that once in place this memorial will not only uniquely recognize contributors but also attract visitors to the College.

Dr. Brahma Chaudhuri, a sessional instructor in the English department, has received a major research grant from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada to work on a book on "Periodicals in Victorian India: 1830–1914." He has also received a Senior Fellowship from the Shastri Indo–Canadian Institute (University of Calgary) in partial support of the same project. The grant and the fellowship will allow Dr. Chaudhuri to undertake research of primary material at the National Library of India in Calcutta, India Office Library in London, and the Bodleian Library at Oxford. When completed, the book will be published by the Modern Language Association of America as part of a series entitled Victorian Periodicals and Empire.

**Dr. Bob Rogers** is one of the speakers in a two-day environmental science seminar for lawyers and business executives in Calgary on May 13–14. Offered by Insight Educational Services, the seminar has been specially designed to provide lawyers and business people with a solid understanding of the scientific terms and principles that underlie environmental regulation and management. Dr. Rogers and Dr. Detlef Birkholz (Manager, Environmental Sciences, Enviro-Test Laboratories) open the seminar on May 13th with a presentation on "General Principles and Definitions."
