## Complete Courses

That two of the first students of Concordia college, Edmonton, had completed their theological courses in St. Louis, Missouri, and accepted calls into the Lutheran ministry was the news brought back from St. Louis by Rev. A. J. Mueller, pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran church and president of the Alberta and British Columbia district.

The successful candidates were Henry Hennig, Golden Spike and P. Unterschuetz, Stony Plain. Both young men were among the first students to enrol at Concordia college when that institution was opened in this city in October, 1921. They completed their six-years' academic course here in 1927 and thereafter specialized for three years in theology at Concordia Lutheran theological seminary in St. Louis. Mr. Hennig will be stationed at Manville, and Mr. Unterschuetz at Rochester, Alberta.

Nineteen of this year's 137 graduates from the Missouri college will take up work in Canada, where the total strength of the Lutheran church is 35,000 baptized members and 121 ministers.
