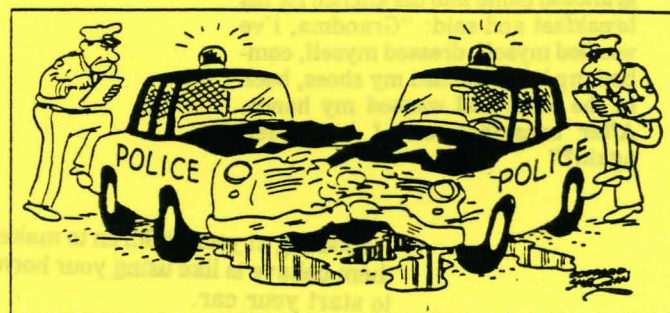

PRO CORO CONCERT TICKETS

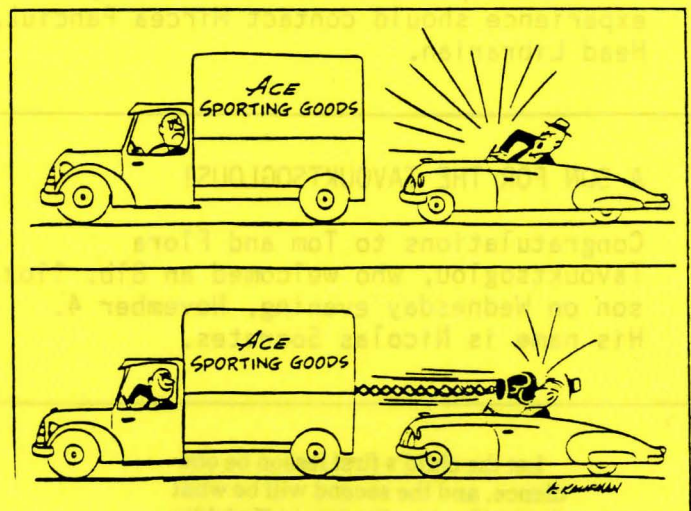
