WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS PROGRAM CONCLUDES

The Career Development Institute's Women Entrepreneurs Re-Entry Program concluded with 'graduation exercises' on March 27. The following is the valedictory address given by Irene Cornwell:

In expressing what the past 14 weeks meant to me, I would include both the tangibles and the intangibles.

As with most things tangible, they are easy to list. From someone who thought successful businesses blossomed beside the road like flowers with the stars shining on good intentions....I now know what a business plan is. I now know how to prepare a business plan. I know my own areas of weakness. I know where to go for counsel and as the saying on the blackboard went....I know I'm on a journey and not at a destination.

As with most things intangible, they are more difficult to define. However, it will be a pleasure to try. I have never belonged to a group more willing to share views and with more respect for one another's perspectives.

And, so to share some of my views on the concept of re-entry. Re-entry as it applies to us as women. From the first time I heard the word a few years ago, I have felt a restlessness with it. I have wanted to redefine the word to fit my own interpretation.

Re-entry....the word all by itself sounds as though a group of women were in a different room, a room separate from the main ballroom....a more dimly lit room....a mundane, unchallenging and behind-the-times room.

And so I've been trying....struggling over the years to redefine the word. Then yesterday, Joan, on the last day of class....over soup and salad....gave words to my thoughts.

"A woman leaving full-time home tasks is a woman merely changing careers."

Joan, do you really know how much those words mean to me - a woman who has spent 28 years with home as a main priority? I do <u>like</u> that phrase because it places value on our "at home contributions" to the community and to the world around us.

It removes the connotation and the word games of phrases like the <u>stay-at-home</u> wife and the stay-at-home mother. Those words which imply a certain cowardice or an essential lack of specific abilities.

Looking at re-entry as a change of career makes a two-way door out of re-entry. We are not bleak little women who are good at cleaning closets. We bring a variety of life skills from one career, gather new skills and then combine them to bring a <u>unique</u> perspective into our wider environment.

In fourteen weeks together, each of you demonstrated your own set of strengths, your own range of talents, your sense of balance, your wonderful sense of humor, your patience with one another and your non-judgmental friendship.

You've proven a re-entry woman isn't entering with an empty tote bag. If accepted....the re-entry woman can become another national resource.

And we should be accepted. I'm developing a certain assertiveness about insisting upon it. No....I cannot haul my two grown children here this evening and say....here are my two degrees....and the 17 year old....he's <u>my</u> diploma....and the 13 and 11 year olds....they are my certificates, not yet completed.

No....even if I could, I wouldn't. Each is an individual in their own right. I cannot frame them.

However, they are the source of the optimism, the flexibility, the persistence, the grounded faith and the self-esteem on my re-entry resume.

Each of you in this room, classmates and instructors, have your own unique people, experiences, formal and informal education...and your <u>own survival</u> <u>resume</u>.

I know you do, because I gained from knowing you one by one.

To each of you....I thank you. You've been of significant encouragement to me. And encouragement and a cordial welcome are what the re-entry woman yearns for.
