King's College Announces Growth Plans

The King's College has launched a 4-year fundraising campaign with a goal of \$7 million to partially meet the funding requirements for College operations and campus development. In May of 1989, the Board of Governors approved the purchase of land at Whitemud and 50th Street in the Millwoods area for a new campus.

The College hopes to open doors to the new facility in September, 1993. The campus master plan will incorporate provisions for future expansion phases to eventually accommodate in excess of 1000 students.

In recommending the renewal of President Henk Van Andel's contract for another five years, the Presidential Evaluation Committee credited Dr. Van Andel with "unfailing vision for the importance of a permanent campus for the College's long-range well-being."

DEAN OF BUSINESS AFFAIRS/COMPTROLLER

As chief business officer of Concordia College, the Dean/Comptroller is responsible for the effective, day-to-day operation of a variety of institutional functions including but not limited to: accounting and finance, budgeting, physical plant, purchasing, bookstore and print shop, and support staff personnel. The Dean/Comptroller reports to the Vice-President for Advancement and Administrative Services and is a member of the Advancement and Administrative Services Council.

Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in finance or business administration; combination of degree and professional credentials (CA/CMA) preferred. Five to seven years of business experience, preferably in a higher education setting. Thorough knowledge of fund accounting and computerized accounting systems, successful supervisory experience in fiscal operations, and the ability to deal positively and effectively with the academic community and public constituencies.

Spoonerisms

Though he enjoyed a distingished career as a clergyman and warden of New College, Oxford, the Rev. William Archibald Spooner (1844-1930) is best known for the type of word play named after him. A nervous man, Spooner often transposed the first letters of words, giving rise to "spoonerisms."

For instance, at one Sunday service, he asked his congregation to sing "From Iceland's Greasy Mountains." At a wedding, he told the groom, "It is kistomary to cuss the bride."

Urging Parliment to pay tribute to "dear old" Queen Victoria, Spooner called for "three cheers for the queer old dean." And when calling on an actual dean, he asked the dean's secretary, "Is the bean dizzy?"

One of Spooner's best-known transpositions occurred when he tried to greet a group of farmers as "sons of toil." You guessed it: "I see before me tons of soil."
