Board of Regents Meeting Highlights

The following does not constitute the minutes of the Board of Regents meeting held on March 21, 1991 but gives meeting highlights:

1. Approved tender documents for the Robert Tegner Student Centre and the new maintenance/delivery building, and authorized the Building Committee to invite responsible companies to submit tenders for the project. The scheduling of tenders is to be coordinated with corporate fund-raising efforts.
2. Heard a report from Mr. Bob Westbury, Vice-President of TransAlta Utilities, who is providing critical assistance for the corporate fund-raising program. Mr. Harry Hole, a prominent Edmonton businessman, has agreed to serve as honorary chairman.
3. Received a Charity Auction report indicating that proceeds are expected to be between \$25-26,000. Mike Walker of the Edmonton Eskimos will serve as honorary chairman again next year.
4. Viewed a video production that will be used for public relations/fund-raising purposes in the church constituency.
5. Accepted the recommendation of the Special Awards Committee that the 1991 Christo Et Ecclesiae Award be presented to Mr. Cliff Raby, and the 1991 Distinguished Service Award to Miss Norma Schwermann.
6. Heard a report from Dr. Sandy Gow on changes in funding for continuing education programs. A review of the Centre for Career Development Innovation (including future programming, and cost and program effectiveness) will be made in the coming weeks, with a report brought to the May Board meeting.
7. Heard a progress report on developments relating to the Education Degree program, and the church work survey. A Church Work Program Committee has been established; members are Dr. Sandy Gow, Prof. Richard Kraemer, Jeannette Lietzau, Rev. Bill Ney and Dr. Bernie Potvin.
8. Learned that the Concordia College Choir is starting to look at the possibility of a European tour in 1993.
9. Heard a report from current Student Association President, Michael Hess; Blair Schmaus, next year's President, was introduced.
10. Directed the Board's Finance Committee to bring a resolution to the May meeting concerning the level of funding received from Lutheran Church-Canada and the implications of such on the sense of ownership of the institution. The resolution will be addressed to LC-C's Board of Directors.
11. Under Personnel:
 - A. Received as information: resignations of Verna Klimack, Dawn Brown and Leonard Busch; full-time support staff appointments of Eileen Goodfellow (Library), Holly Dahl (Advancement/Admin.) and Anita Wagner (Business Office).
 - B. Approved a new position description for the Clerk-Typist in the Business Office.
 - C. Approved the appointments of the following college sessional instructors from January 1 through April 30, 1991: Ben Bradford (Computing Science), Bruce Monkhouse (Ed. Psych.).
 - D. Approved a reduction in teaching load in 1991/92 for Dr. Annabel Coldeway and Dr. Chris Earle.
 - E. Approved a special educational leave for Mrs. Valerie Knipp from September 1, 1991 through June 30, 1992.
