

\$105,000 Girls' Dormitory To Be Built At Concordia

The student body of Concordia assembled outside of the college Tuesday for a brief ground-breaking ceremony to mark the beginning of construction of the new girls' dormitory.

The president, Rev. W. M. Wangerin, gave a short address and Prof. Arnold Guebert helped in the service. Donata Hippe, the chairman of the girls' council, also took part. Among others present were pastors from the vicinity.

The modern dormitory will accommodate 40 girls, besides having a large lounge with a suite for the girls' counsellors. This building will be located on the west side of the college administration building.

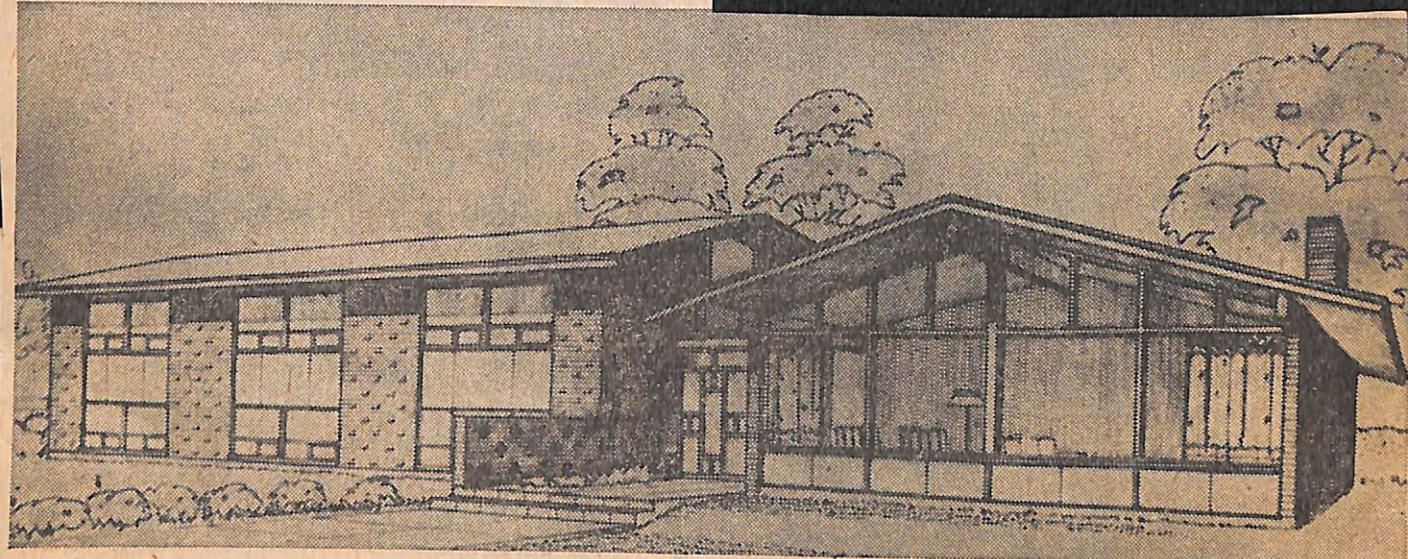
The \$105,000 split-level structure will accommodate the girls in 20 bedrooms, which feature built-in

desks, wardrobe closets and dressers. The main lounge will have a kitchenette for entertaining guests of the students.

Architect K. C. Stanley has given the dormitory a residential character. Natural finishes are used extensively on the interior. The outside will be of brick over a reinforced concrete frame and provision has been made for the addition of another 20 rooms in future.

With construction beginning this week, completion of the dormitory is expected in February or early March.

It is hoped that the new dormitory will build up the enrolment of girls in future years and also encourage more teacher training students to enter Concordia.
