Concordia College, in accordance with its primary purpose of training Lutheran pastors and teachers, has launched a year-round program of student recruitment. At the present time, Dean Erich A. von Fange has the names of 750 prospective students on file in a punch card system. From this, information about prospective students can be obtained in a moment's notice.

The names of prospective students for the college are provided by pastors, parents, students, friends and alumni. Before Christmas, Concordia's students wrote personal letters to many good prospects throughout western Canada, giving them their personal opinions, as young people, about the advantages of attending Concordia.

The college hopes to have at least one-tenth of these 750 prospective students on the campus next fall.
