# DEGREE PROGRAMS AT CONCORDIA COLLEGE

Concordia College offers three-year general degree programs in the Faculties of Arts and Science. These programs have been designed to meet the following objectives:

- 1. Students should receive a broad introduction to the academic disciplines in the arts and sciences as well as a concentration in one discipline.
- 2. Students should be required to study religious and ethical issues as a distinct discipline in the arts as well as an important component of all knowledge.
- 3. Students should be exposed to a variety of courses in which skills in writing, oral communication, and computer use are taught and encouraged.
- 4. Students of all ages and educational backgrounds should have the opportunity to achieve an undergraduate degree.
- 5. Students should have the opportunity to take courses in education, business, and other disciplines outside of the traditional arts and science curricula.

## B. General Academic Requirements

The Bachelor of Arts and the Bachelor of Science programs contain a number of similarities. These include:

- 1. 15 full course equivalents (FCE) with 90 total credits.
- 2. A core requirement of 5.5 FCE (B.A.) and 5 FCE (B.Sc.).
- 3. A principal subject of concentration of 4-5 FCE (5.5 FCE in music).
- 4. A secondary subject of concentration of 3-4 FCE that provides the opportunity for all students to choose a secondary subject of concentration from subjects in arts and science.
- 5. A maximum of 1 FCE in English and Religious Studies at the junior level will be permitted.
- 6. A maximum of 7 FCE at the junior level will be credited toward a degree.
- (8 FCE in music for Bachelor of Arts).
- 7. In the first year, only 1 FCE from each discipline will be permitted (with the exception of mathematics and music).
- 8. For the Bachelor of Arts, a student must present credit in a Language 30 or other English or Language 100.
- (Language 100 will be counted for the degree if the student is admitted with full matriculation credit).
- 9. Core course requirements may be included in the major and minor concentrations. However, the same courses may not be counted toward both major and minor requirements.
- 10. At least the final 5 FCE must be taken at Concordia College.
- 11. A minimum of 3 credits in each of 6 disciplines is required.
- 12. A maximum of 30 credits in any one discipline will be permitted. (33 in music for B.A.).

# DEGREE PROGRAMS (cont'd.)

13. A minimum of 72 credits in arts and science courses will be required.
14. For the B.A. degree, at least 42 credits must be taken from arts courses.
15. For the B.Sc. degree, at least 42 credits must be taken from science courses.

16. A student may receive up to 60 transfer credits from another institution. Transfer credits may vary depending on program requirements.

# C. Graduation Requirements

Students will be considered eligible for graduation if they have:

- 1. Completed the requirements of their programs.
- 2. Maintained a minimum grade point average of 5.0. (Students who complete the program with a grade point average of 7.5 or higher will be awarded the degree "With Distinction").
- 3. Made formal application for a Concordia College Degree.

## D. Areas of Concentration

Principal Subject of Concentration (Major):
Composed of 4-5 FCE in the discipline (24-30 credits) with the exception of music, 5.5 FCE (33 credits).
At least 3 FCE at the senior level including at least 0.5 FCE in a 400-level Senior Seminar.

1. Majors Available in Bachelor of Arts English: Required courses - English 200 or 210, and 490. Music: Required courses - Music 250, 251 and 490; and three of 201, 202, 206, 224 and 240 or 241. Psychology: Required courses -Psychology 260, 261, 309 and 490. Religious Studies: Required courses -Religion 200 and 490. (Students majoring in Religious Studies are strongly recommended to take at least one of: Religious Studies 300, 301, 302, 303, 304, 314, 315 or 321 at the University of Alberta. Visiting student status will be arranged by the Registrar.)

2. Majors Available in Bachelor of Science:
Biology/Zoology: Required courses - 2 of Biology 200, 297, Botany 205, or Zoology 220; and Biology 490.

E. Secondary Subject of Concentration

Composed of 3-4 FCE in the discipline (18-24 credits). At least 1 FCE at the senior level.

(The terms full course equivalent (FCE), full year course and 6 credit course can be used interchangeably. Two three credit courses equate to one full course equivalent.)


