3. New faculty office space has been created in the Grady House and the offices vacated by Development.

BOARD OF REGENTS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following does not constitute the minutes of the Board of Regents meeting held on July 30, 1987, but gives highlights of Board action:

- 1. Received news that the Concordia College Choir will be singing on the Lutheran Hour again in August, and on the Canadian Thanksgiving Special Lutheran Hour broadcast on October 11, 1987.
- 2. Received a report that the June 30, 1987 balance sheet will probably show an accumulated deficit of approximately \$300,000, approximately \$50,000 less than on June 30, 1986.

3. Heard a Development report and a Financial report.

- 4. Approved a study to find additional library space for the 1988-1989 school year.
- 5. Adopted a theme for the 1987-1988 school year: "Strong in the Lord," based on Isaiah 40:31.
- 6. Agreed to sign an Indenture of Agreement for extension of the affiliation agreement with the University of Alberta.
- 7. Approved earlier Executive Committee action to lease space at Braemar School and to sell the 7340 Ada property. Income from sale of the property will be used to purchase property from the City of Edmonton.

8. Received a projected enrollment report for 1987-1988.

- 9. Agreed to offer land to the Alberta-British Columbia District for its new office building at the same price as paid by Concordia College to the City of Edmonton for land purchased in 1987.
- 10. Met with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod's Board for Higher Education Services for approximately two hours.

11. Received a report from the President.

- 12. Toured the Concordia College Braemar Campus and held half of the Board of Regents meeting on the Braemar Campus.
- 13. Received a report from Board of Regents member Claudia Hack on the Lutheran Historical Institute.
- 14. Discussed Higher Education Committee-Concordia College coordination, and asked the Board of Regents Chairman and Executive Officer to meet with the HEC soon to discuss areas of mutual concern.
- 15. Passed a motion to thank those instrumental in making it possible for Concordia College to grant Bachelor of Arts (General) and Bachelor of Science (General) degrees.
- Under personnel, the Board of Regents: 1) approved a job description for the position of secretary to the Dean of Student Affairs and Spiritual Life Coordinator; 2) appointed Professor Richard Willie to the Archives Committee to replace Professor Lowell Eckert; 3) appointed Mr. Edmund Mielke as Men's Dormitory Counselor for the 1987-1988 academic year; 4) appointed Dr. Stephen C. Stohlmann as Visiting Associate Professor of Religious Studies for the 1988-1989 academic year; 5) appointed Dr. Shelley Lorimer as Assistant Professor of Physics; 6) appointed Dr. John J. Nelson as Visiting Assistant Professor of Sociology; and 7) appointed the following to sessional positions for the 1987-1988 academic year: Luma Chernenkoff, Janice Dawson, Michael Hertwig-Jaksch, Zophia Kamela, Bruce Monkhouse, Nick Musa and Audrey O'Brien.
- 17. Agreed to hold the next quarterly meeting on November 27, 1987.
