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## **We Build!**

The waiting is over! It's time to build! Alberco Construction's equipment will move into the parking lot behind Schwermann Hall next week to begin construction of the Robert Tegler Student Centre.

Acting on the recommendation of its Finance Committee, Concordia's Board of Regents last Friday voted via telephone conference call to begin construction of the Centre. Final approval of Lutheran Church-Canada's Board of Directors was received on Monday morning.

About \$1.9 million has already been pledged for the project. In early June a fund-raising campaign was begun in the corporate sector to cover the remaining costs of construction. The hope, of course, is to raise sufficient funds to pay for furnishings and landscaping as well. President Kraemer and Development personnel have been expending a great amount of time and effort in this area. Please continue to give them your encouragement and support.

A ground-breaking ceremony is being planned for Friday morning, August 30th, when Board members will be here for their quarterly meeting.

An extra amount of patience, consideration and co-operation from everyone will be the order of the day during the next year, as we deal with the noise and inconvenience a building project of this size is sure to bring.
