Concordia Enters Age of Modern Telephone Technology!

On Monday evening, June 8, the Highlands Campus telephone system will be converted to Northern Telecom's Meridian I communication system. New telephones will be installed in all offices; new extension numbers have been assigned all staff (see list attached).

EdTel personnel held training sessions for available staff on Friday afternoon (June 5) and all day Monday (June 8). People unable to participate then will receive in-house training over the summer months — contact Betty Clark to arrange times.

Software features of the Meridian Digital Telephones include Conference, Transfer, Forward, Call Park and Ring Again.

Two specialized applications will be brought on stream during coming weeks. More details will be provided as they are introduced.

- 1. Automatic Call Distribution (ACD): calls can be directed to an extension without going through an operator. This will be particularly appreciated by campus staff here after hours!
- 2. Meridian Mail voice messaging: callers are invited to leave detailed recorded messages at individual extensions, thus eliminating busy signals or waiting time.

As with all new 'toys,' the Meridian I system will probably take a bit of getting used to! There is no doubt, however, that the long term 'gain' will quickly erase any short term 'pain.'
