


CONCERT CHOIR AT CONCORDIA — The famous Gustavus Adolphus College Choir of St. Peter Minn., will appear in Edmonton Monday. Pictured above, the choir which will

The Gustavus Choir of St. Peter, Minnesota, now in its 30th season, will present a concert Monday night at Concordia College under the sponsorship of the Edmonton Lutheran Council.

The choir of 70 singers was one of five choirs selected to appear at the third assembly of the Lutheran World Federation. The Gustavus choir has travelled through 40 of the 50 American states and in most of the Canadian provinces.

Gustavus Adolphus College, the home of the choir, is noted for its choral activity with several hundred students competing each year for places in four active choral groups. The college was founded by Swedish pioneers and most of the students are of Scandinavian descent.
