Iron Curtain Christianity Is Discussed

Dr. Eugene R. Bertermann of St. Louis, Mo., this week completed a series of seminars in Alberta with an address to more than 100 Lutheran laymen in Concordia College.

Dr. Bertermann showed slides taken in Russia, Yugoslavia and other Iron Curtain countries.

Although the activities of the church are severely handicapped in these countries due to pressure from official sources, he said the people still have an opportunity to hear the Christian message.

The speaker has also appeared at Fairview, Wetaskiwin and Bruderheim. The seminars were sponsored by the northern Alberta zone of the Lutheran Laymen's League.

The seminars have given persons the opportunity to discuss the church's work in the Iron Curtain countries and some of the problems which are encountered.
