Search Begins for Vice-President for Student Services

Applications and nominations are invited for the position of Vice-President for Student Services, to take office on July 1, 1992.

The VPSS is responsible for providing services to a diverse student population and designing programs to maximize students' abilities to succeed in their academic endeavors, as well as to foster their growth and development as individuals. This position requires skill in interfacing with other offices of the College, and an ability for sound advocacy on behalf of student interests. The successful candidate must communicate effectively with student groups, faculty and staff, be a seasoned administrator with experience in student development, and demonstrate a thorough knowledge of academic life.

Areas supervised by the VPSS include admissions, registration, student affairs, spiritual life, counselling residence and co-curricular programs, financial aid and placement.

Qualifications for this combined administrative/teaching position: administrative experience in a post-secondary setting (preferably in the area of student services) that includes management of programs, budget and personnel; commitment to the philosophy of student development; leadership and managerial skills, including the ability to organize, motivate, plan and evaluate; effective interpersonal skills; excellent verbal and written communication skills; preference for earned doctorate with credentials to teach in Religious Studies, Parish Services or the Social Sciences.

Candidates should submit an up-to-date curriculum vitae and three letters of reference to Richard W. Kraemer, President by February 14, 1992.

News from U.C.E.P. (contributed by Mary Nelson)

We've been so busy at U.C.E.P. setting up this year's program--our 7th--that we haven't been sending much news out. We need to catch up!

The Native Program--U.C.E.P. I--is still nestled in Frantz House on the Highlands Campus, and U.C.E.P. II fills the rooms of one entire corridor at Braemar. (The water fountains are still knee-high!) A total of 163 students are enrolled in the two programs. Returning staff include Dean Marilyn Westbury, Don Pimm (English, History), Colleen Cooper (Mathematics), Harry Klann (Mathematics), Sue Mills (Chemistry), Robert Campbell (Biology), Mary Nelson (English), and Roslyn Beswick (Counsellor).

Don Biamonte, a former department head at Archbishop MacDonald High School, joined us in September to teach one section of English 90. Don, who has a special interest in speech and drama, invited his colleague, Walter Kaasa, to entertain and enlighten English classes one day in October. Many U.C.E.P. students are planning to see Mr. Kaasa in Chinook Theatre's production of A Christmas Carol on December 6th.

Karen Baugh is the new counsellor for the Native students. Formerly employed by Career Development & Employment, Karen's office this year is in Frantz House.

Our course offerings are expanding; this fall Don Pimm initiated a History of Western Europe through Art. In the spring, Sue Mills will teach an eight-week course in Physics.

At Thanksgiving, U.C.E.P. students at Highlands prepared and hosted a delicious buffet for themselves and the staff of the Native program. An elder blessed the food and a small portion of each dish was left outside after the meal, for the spirits.

At the beginning of October, Rob Campbell and Sue Mills attended the A.T.A. Science Conference in Red Deer. Recommendations for the revised Science Curriculum, including implications for the departmental exams, were presented.

Many local theatre groups will generously subsidize student tickets to their productions. Forty U.C.E.P. students and guests attended a brilliant performance of "Romeo and Juliet" at the Citadel Theatre on November 10. Currently, another group is making plans to see John Murrell's "Democracy" on the Shoctor stage.

Roslyn Beswick and Karen Baugh attended the Educational Liaison Association of Alberta (E.L.A.A.) Conference in Banff in late October. Representatives from all post-secondary institutions in Alberta provided counsellors with admission and program updates and changes for 1992-93.
