## 400 Attend Dedication College Dormitory

About 400 persons attended the dedication ceremony Sunday evening for the newly built girls' dormitory at Concordia College, 71 St. and Ada Boulevard.

Miss Donata Hippe, chairman of the girls' council, received the key from the architect, K. C. Stanley, and conducted the group through the building.

Main speaker at the preceding

service was Rev. Oliver Harms, Houston, Texas, chairman of the committee on colleges of the Lutheran Church. Ald. Clifford Roy represented the city.

Other guests included Hon. A. O. Aalborg, minister of education; B. E. Walker, associate professor of education at the University of Alberta, and Rev. W. C. Eifert, executive secretary of the Alberta and British Columbia church district.

The new building will house 40 women students, and is part of the special campaign of the Lutheran Church to gain more teacher-training students. It cost \$105,000.

### CHORAL PROGRAM

In conjunction with the dedication ceremony, the Lutheran Choral Society of Edmonton and district held its third annual program of sacred music in the Concordia auditorium Sunday afternoon. The choir was made up of 200 voices from 10 choirs. Churches represented were: Immanuel, Brightview; Grace, Camrose; Redeemer, Grace, St. Peter's, and the Concordia choristers, Edmonton; Bethany, Fort Saskatchewan; Zion, Wetaskiwin; St. Matthew's, Stony Plain.

Dr. A. H. Schwermann conducted the choir. Pianist was Miss Anna Behrands.

An organ solo, "Our Father Who Art in Heaven," by Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, was played by Miss Marvelyn Schwermann, organist of St. Peter's Church.

### CLASSICAL SELECTIONS

The program of singing included "Lord of Hosts, Great Ruler," by Rachmaninoff; three "St. Matthew's Passion" chorales, by Bach; "Out of the Depths," by Bach; "Brother James Air," (Psalm 23) by James Blain; "Hymn to the Trinity," Tchaikovsky; "Prayer of Thanksgiving," a Netherlands folk song; "O, Jesus, Be Near," Edvard Grieg; "A Virgin Most Pure," an English folk carol; "Glory Be to God in Heaven," an old French carol; "In Heavenly Love Abiding," Pinsuti; "Praise Ye the Lord, the Almighty," from the Stralsund Gesangbuch; "Awake My Heart with Gladness," by Cruger; "Rock of Ages," by Thomas Hastings; "Praise Ye the Faith," by Gounod.

The audience joined in the singing of "Abide with Me" and "Son of My Soul."

Only one joint rehearsal is held before the concert. Two sectional rehearsals were held in Wetaskiwin and Edmonton.
