Nova Scotia College Seeks President

The University of King's College in Halifax invites applications for the position of University President, effective July 1, 1993.

The University of King's College is a 200-year-old university, with an enrolment of 700. It is situated on the Dalhousie University campus and associated with Dalhousie in its Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences and its Faculty of Science. King's grants degrees in Journalism, offers an interdisciplinary Foundation Year Programme for first-year students in all disciplines, and is discussing with Dalhousie a proposal for a joint degree in Contemporary Studies. King's has residential accommodation on campus for about 250 students.

The President, who is also Vice-Chancellor, is responsible for the administration of the University, and reports to the Board of Governors. The President may also teach a course in one of the University's programmes.


