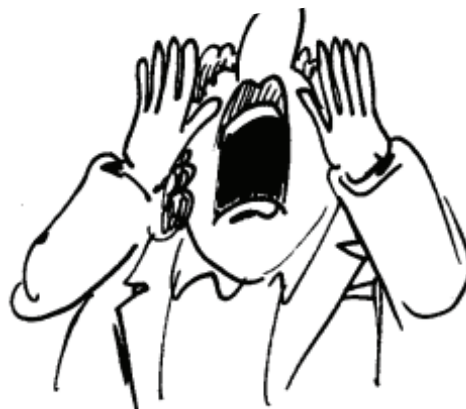

\$3,000 Business Student Scholarship

The Stony Plain & District Chamber of Commerce will award **\$3,000** to one student who has resided in the Tri-Municipal area during her or his high school years. The applicant must have successfully completed one, two or three years of study towards a business degree, diploma or certificate and is continuing on in her or his studies full time.

A completed application must be received in the Stony Plain & District Chamber of Commerce office no later than 4:00 P.M. on Thursday, September 29, 2011. The winner will be announced at the Chambers' Awards Gala on October 22, 2011.

A completed application will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- the completeness of the information requested
- contact information for the applicant
- a transcript from the last completed year of study and an explanation of the field of study
- proof of full time status for a second or third year of study for the 2011/12 school year
- the date of high school graduation and the school from which she or he graduated
- a summary of work experience
- a summary of extra-curricular activities
- a summary of community involvement in the Tri-Municipal area
- 1 letter of support from an instructor at her or his school of study
- 2 letters of support from individuals in the Tri-Municipal area who must address each of the following: applicant's entrepreneurial skills, academic abilities, leadership and/or community involvement
- a signed acknowledgement and authorization of application (shown below).

Applicants selected as finalists should be prepared to be interviewed by a selection committee if required. All applicants will be notified in writing after Thursday, September 29, 2011 as to the status of her or his application.
