





Award Description

For the 2013-2014 academic year, one undergraduate and one graduate award be given to a Business, Commerce, Management, or Information Systems graduate and undergraduate student. Applicants must: a) have demonstrated strong leadership and work ethics qualities, in addition to an adequate academic performance; b) aim to pursue a career in internal auditing and consultancy upon graduation; and, c) be fully committed to passing all three Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) exam parts within 24 months of receiving their academic degree.

The award break down and payment procedures will be as follows: Each award recipient will be reimbursed for up to \$1,000 for expenses associated with purchasing CIA exam prep material, IIA student membership, CIA application and testing fees. Purchase receipts for eligible expenses must be presented to the Edmonton chapter certification director within 24 months from the award winner's official date of graduation.

Eligibility

- Third or fourth student year status for undergraduates. Graduate applicants need to have been in their program for a minimum of three (3) semesters.
- Applicants must be pursuing a business-related degree (ex: business, management, commerce, information systems, accounting, etc...)
- Minimum Completed Course requirements (undergrads):
 - A minimum of two (2) accounting courses;
 - At least one 300 or 400 (or higher) level finance course with a focus on corporate finance or managerial finance.
 - At least one computer science, AIS or MIS course (Computer courses that deal only with one or more Microsoft applications do not qualify);
- Minimum GPA of 3.00 for the past three (3) semesters;
- Demonstrated leadership and work ethics qualities, as evidenced by a professor or former supervisor letter of recommendation.

Award Deadline and Application Procedures

Student deadline for this award is March 3rd, 2014 at 1 PM. Award winners will be announced sometime during April of 2014.
