Concordia. The Dean of Student Affairs told CSA Blue and White that this was the first assault crime he has ever had here. Dean Stuhlmiller has worked here for 23 years. While minor arguments have broken out, this is the first time the police have been involved.

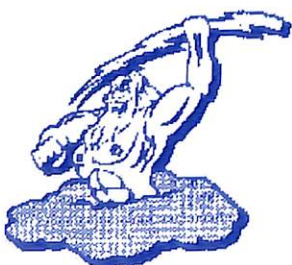
