First Aid

The Commissionaire's provide the Security service for Concordia. They are all trained in First Aid. Should you need assistance contact Security on 780 479-8761 or 5555 from an internal phone.

Concordia has two AED's, commonly called Defibrillators. One is located on the west wall of the Robert Tegler Student Centre, on the left side of the doors that lead into Alumni Hall. The other is located outside the interior doors into the Ralph King Athletic Centre on the main floor of Continuing Education Centre. AEDs are easy to operate, a link to a useful demonstration is below, this will help familiarise yourself with how to operate our AED's if you haven't been trained.

Security Tips

Be Safe

Although Concordia has a very low crime rate, every year a few students at Concordia are victims of acts of vandalism, theft or assault.

Never leave your valuables; laptop, packages, purses or wallets unattended. That quick walk to the cafeteria washroom is all the time it takes to lose your valuables.

Always keep expensive items on your person. Lockers and cars are easily broken into. Better yet, don't bring these articles to campus unless absolute-ly necessary.
