POLITICS **Bolivia** and the Voice of Authority

by Simone Alaine Polo Organizing the political - what shape should our political organization take? - is perhaps one of the most controversial issues one will encounter. This only becomes more troublesome once one asks "By what criteria are we justified in organizing the political?" Not only that, but we can interrogate whatever justification is presented to the point to which it is sustained by arbitrary claims. 
