OPPORTUNITIES IN MUSIC

Be a part of activities beyond "pure academics" by getting involved in MUSIC.

Become a member of a Concordia music ensemble:

The Concordia Concert Choir – This most popular student ensemble includes students from a wide range of disciplines, not just music. While *some* music background is certainly helpful, not everyone comes with choral experience. Auditions (which are more like interviews with some singing) are required; sign -up outside office A-302. Don't be nervous. (Note that some time schedule conflicts (like labs) may be accommodated.)

The Concordia Ringers – A university-level handbell ensemble comprised of students with some music reading background, although not necessarily handbell experience.

Festival City Winds – A three-tiered community band program provides wind ensemble experience to Concordia students. Wind and percussion players find a home in one of the three Festival City Winds bands as assigned by the director. Placement auditions are required.

Concordia Symphony Orchestra – Concordia string players can play in the orchestra following a successful audition. Orchestra members generally have some regular orchestra or string playing experience. Auditions are required.

These ensembles are all credited courses. The 1.5 credits each semester could take students up to the maximum of 16.5 credits course load (the usual course load is five three-credit courses or 15 credits). Course additions and changes can be made during the first week of class. These credits count for the Fine Arts requirement, among other things.

Not interested in ensemble? Take private lessons in voice or an instrument for academic credit (in guitar, you'll receive class instruction). The applied music courses are 1.5 credits and can easily fit into one's schedule. Chat with someone in the Music Department (Alumni Hall – upstairs) to explore your options or contact Dr. John Hooper at john.hooper@concordia.ab.ca.

Your Statement of Account is available online at <u>https://onlineservices.concordia.ab.ca/</u> <u>student/</u> Account information is generally updated in 2 – 3 business days.

Your online statement will include payments, billing adjustments due to course changes and credit of scholarships/bursaries, if applicable.

Paper statements will no longer be mailed once classes begin. If you require a paper statement, please request one at the Student Accounts Office. Otherwise, please check Online Student Services for information on your account.

You will be notified by email instructing you to check your statement online if your billing has changed or if scholarships and/or bursaries have been credited to your account.
