The Book Arts

Library Gallery

Now until January 28th!

The Book Arts exhibition explores books as objects of beauty, personal expression and curiosity, and celebrates the imagination, inventiveness and skill of the artists who produce them. The show features 29 examples of work by artists from across Alberta as well as from Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Many of the artists are members of the Calgary and Edmonton chapters of the Canadian Book Binders and Book Artists Guild.

Curator, Dean Tatam Reeves notes that *The Book Arts* exhibition was inspired by the important work of community libraries that provide public access to Alberta art.

The Book Arts was developed with the assistance of Arts on Atlantic Gallery, Calgary, and the Canadian Book Artists and Book Binders Guild (CBBAG), Calgary Chapter. The exhibition was produced by the Esplanade Arts & Heritage Centre in Medicine Hat for the Alberta Foundation for the Arts Travelling Exhibition Program (TREX), southeast region.

Alberta Smithsonian Internship (ASIP)

ASIP offers students "a chance to experience history" (Vue, 2009) and the opportunity to gain international work experience in their field of study. Each year, the ASIP funds 10 interns, either at the Smithsonian complex in Washington DC (not to be confused with the Washington Centre) or at one of its several affiliated sites. Internships range from two months to a maximum of four months between May and December each year.
