
Avoid it like the very devil! Have absolutely no truck or trade with it! Tell everyone you know and talk to, to similarly avoid it. Pass the message on!

Must Own Albums

With the dawn of the new millennium came an overabundance of "Best of..." lists. Writers from every media source came up with their own list of what was seminal within the annals of human history. So here is mine, eleven months late because I am the king of procrastination: a list of albums that I feel any record collection is incomplete without.

Pennywise-Unknown Road (Epitaph Records)

What do you get when you combine driving guitars with metal-inspired riffs, ripping bass lines that tear you apart, an amazing drummer that leaves you scratching your head in disbelief, and an educated lyricist with a great voice? You get an album that has inspired dozens of bands to attempt to copy the sound that Pennywise has made famous.

You can sing along to every song and learn something on a personal level ("Unknown Road", "Try to Conform") or you can yell along to the anthems about society's struggles ("Homesick," "Give and Get").

When you desire a sonic punch to the face or kick to the crotch or if you find yourself in need of venting frustration, this album will foot the bill every time. Put this record on and prepare yourself for the most fist-pumping and glass-shattering forty minutes you will ever experience thanks to these boys from Hermosa Beach.

Ozzy Osbourne-Tribute (Epic Records)

As much as Live at Budokan was a monumental record, so was Tribute for any metal fan growing up in the eighties. If you think that I may be exaggerating because I hold a soft spot for this record since it was the first album that I ever bought, I suggest you listen to it yourself and just try to deny that it does not destroy every other live album out there. Just try to deny that Randy Rhoads was the best guitar player since Jimi Hendrix and that nobody else has even been close to touching him. Just try to deny that Ozzy had an all-star metal line-up with Rhoads, Rudy Sarzo ripping on bass, and Tommy Aldridge pounding the drums. Just try to deny that this album grabs you by the throat and does not let go for over seventy minutes until it ends with studio outtakes allowing Randy Rhoads' obvious technical skills a chance to shine. Just try to deny that after listening to this album you have become an Ozzy fan and that you now worship at the altar of Rhoads.

Go out and get this album and come back and try to deny all these things...you liar!

Ten Foot Pole-Rev (Epitaph Records)

This could be the best album I own. Having said that, I must admit that after hearing the TFP albums released since Rev I have something to say to the band: Give up! Without Tony and Scott you are a disgrace to yourselves and should just pack it in.

This is one of the few albums that I own that I would dare to call perfect; there is nothing about it that I would change, not even its length, because when its over I am satiated and ready to listen to something else because I know that the next time I listen to it I will enjoy it even more than the time previous. I will never get sick of listening to this album.

Scott has an inimitable voice, proven by TFP live shows since he has left the band where Dennis attempts, and fails, to copy his style for the older songs. Tony's drum-work varies from controlled to violent and is always mind-bogglingly appropriate; he keeps it interesting without being excessive. TFP is one of the few dual-guitar bands where it actually sounds like there are two guitarists. Not only do Steve and Dennis play differing guitar lines most of the time but they do it with different styles. Dennis has got the trebly staccato attack while Steve has got the thicker driving force. Not only does this make the music interesting to listen to but also to think about. Rev is an album that has music that is more intelligent than its lyrics.

After having lauded all this praise on this album already, I have to say that what I love most about Rev is that with every listen I find something new to appreciate. At first it was simply the catchy hooks and infectious melodies but now it can be something as seemingly unimportant as feedback or a drum fill that will cause a rush of excitement to run through me.

Everything that Ten Foot Pole has released since this album has paled in comparison but I guess it is unfair to expect a band to be able to follow up a masterpiece with anything comparable.

Def Leppard-High 'N' Dry (Polygram Records)

If you believe that the only good things to come out of the United Kingdom are tea and crumpets, and that movie about the dudes who flash their wieners for cash, then you have obviously forgotten about the fab five...Def Leppard.

It is perfectly understandable to forget "The Leps" if the only material you have been exposed to is from Hysteria and later; however, if you have heard anything from their first three albums you would find it impossible to forget Sheffield's favourite sons.

Almost twenty years after the fact Def Leppard's second album, High 'N' Dry, is still their calling card. It contains all the rocking urgency of their debut record, On Through the Night, but is better produced without falling into the trap of over-production like their follow-up release, Pyromania. It is my humble opinion that Mr. Shania Twain, producer extraordinaire, is a huge reason for the downfall of one of the greatest rock bands ever. Not many people could make the group who wrote "Rock Brigade" sound like robots but "Mutt" Lange manages to do it on Hysteria.

From the opening chords of "Let it Go" to the repetitive finale of "No, No, No", High 'N' Dry kicks out the rocking numbers one after another. Even the ballad "Bringin" on the Heartbreak" has guts. But the outstanding tracks are the ripping instrumental "Switch 625" and the blistering "You Got Me Runnin"

Another reason for the downfall of Def Leppard was the decision to kick out founding guitarist Pete Willis because of his drinking problem (talk about the pot calling the kettle black, Steve Clark drank himself to death). Besides being the one who brought the band out of the Sheffield spoon factory that was their rehearsal space and into instant popularity, Pete Willis wrote or co-wrote the majority of the material on their first three albums.

For a little guy he was able to play big riffs on his Hamer and look cool doing it. And even though he got the boot, and was replaced, during the recording of Pyromania, his songs and guitar tracks are still inspiring the album. Yet another reason why the post-Willis Def Leppard material sucks! Do we all remember "Do You Wanna Get Rocked"? Oh, how far have we fallen?

Despite how crappy this band has been for the past fifteen years, High 'N' Dry still stands as a testament to how good they were. This album rocks so much that I was able to listen to it all the way on the drive home from Seattle. When was the last time you listened to a record for fourteen hours straight? I rest my case. All hail Pete Willis, for we are the Rock Brigade.


