THE END OF THE WORLD AS WE KNOW IT?

Though about twenty tons of particles the size of grains of sand are said to fall on the earth on any given day and thousands of larger meteorites, perhaps the size of a chunk of coal, also fall harmlessly onto our earth, when the comet Swift-Tuttle hits it will be far from harmless. Unfortunately this is estimated to occur on August 14, 2126—not in time to defer final exams!

Swift-Tuttle, named after a couple of American astronomers who sighted it during the Civil War, is by no means new to our solar system. Not only does the comet emit its regular Perseid meteor showers, which is debris shed from its passage near earth, but it was last sighted in 1862. It was expected to be visible from earth again in 1982, though it did not reappear again until September 27th of this year. It was supposedly also sighted by a Jesuit priest in Beijing in 1737, though it is difficult to say whether or not this was Swift-Tuttle.

The point is that Swift-Tuttle, approximately 6 miles or 10-20 km in diameter, would alter the earth as we know it. Though sources vary on their predictions of the effects of orbital

collision, Sharon Begley from *Newsweek* estimates that as this comet hits at one hundred times the speed of a bullet and with more force than a hundred megatons of explosive, everything within a 150 mile radius would be destroyed. According to Professor Doug Hube of the U of A, the impact would form a definite crater, but it would not otherwise alter the earth's mantle. The changes, says Dr. Hube, will be in the effects on the climate and the atmosphere as the energy released will form a cloud cover, it is predicted, which would reflect the sunlight back out to space causing a lowering in atmospheric temperatures. The problem is that no one, despite predictions, can tell where the comet might hit. If it hit a major urban area, it would certainly destroy it and the resulting shock waves would be felt up to ten to twenty kilometers away, as was the case with the comet that hit in Siberia in 1905.

Other comets and asteroids, besides the comet that fell in Siberia in 1905, are said to have altered the earth before. In fact, there is strong evidence in the scientific community to suggest that the extinction of dinosaur life may have been

caused by such an event. Although the ball that hit the earth back then was probably an asteroid, which is much harder in substance than a comet, we must not underestimate the possible damage from Swift-Tuttle. Just because Swift-Tuttle is composed of planetary dust, ammonia, methane, and water ice and some organic compounds like most other comets, and would probably undergo change as it entered the earth's atmosphere, does not mean it will be harmless. Nonetheless, the collision would be more harmful if Swift-Tuttle was an asteroid formed solely of rock.

The estimated date of impact, by examining the comets elliptical orbit around the sun, is August 14, 2126. If by then we have not devised some method of either intercepting it or destroying it, then perhaps the end of the world as we know it will be contemplable. In the mean time, the end of semester is upon us, and I suggest that, although this article has taken your mind off your exams for just a short while, you hit the books.

The difference between a black person and a white person is the pigmentation of each person's skin. This is an insignificant and superficial difference, yet for centuries it has been the basis of discrimination and oppression against blacks all over the world. Discriminating on the basis of a physical feature is an unjustifiable concept, and one that is held only by people who are either profoundly ignorant, or by those who have something to lose by acknowledging the equality of another physically distinct group of people.

Women are different from men in only one apparent way: anatomically. Yet, like blacks, they too have been the victims of segregation, alienation, and oppression. While men benefitted from the Renaissance and Enlighten-

ment, women were denied the right to attend university. When men went to the polls, women were made to feel uncomfortable about even offering a comment about politics around the supper table. As men acquired material goods and property during the industrial revolution, women were considered unfit to manage their own affairs. And in the church men alone possessed the right to become clergy.

In our day women have overcome almost all restrictions against their rights. They are doctors and lawyers; not only do they vote, but they are also politicians; and many women now hold prominent positions in the business world. Tragically, the last stronghold of discrimination against women seems to be the church. Whether you are a Christian or not you should be concerned with the resistance of the church to allow women to become clergy. This is not an exclusively religious issue; it goes beyond the doctrines of the various churches (most of which are man made and differ considerably) to the larger problem of whether any particular group in society (religious or otherwise) has the right to discriminate on the basis of gender. As a Christian I am pleased to see that the Anglican church has realized the error of its ways, and now allows women to become Preistesses. I hope that in the next few years Protestantism and Catholicism will realize that anatomy is not a sound criterion for deciding who will and who will not be clergy. After all, "God created man[kind] in his own image,...male and female he created them" (Genesis 1:27); so who are we to exclude women if, like men, they are created in God's image?

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CAFETERIA VS. COFFEE SHOP

Many questions have been asked concerning the delay of the proposed coffee shop. The coffee shop, which will be installed in the Tegler Centre, would be there to sell pastries, fresh sandwiches, soup, and specialty and gourmet coffees. Due to the questions, I interviewed VP of student services, Ron Jones, and from his perspective he had done all he could with the proposed shop. The delay is due to the extended discussions with contractors and potential businesses that would head up the

shop. Although money is not the issue, a permanent shop would cost about fifty thousand and a portable one about eighteen thousand dollars. According to Mr. Jones, the coffee shop will be available for service sometime in the next semester. Treating the issue fairly, I spoke with the Prez of Student Council, Deb Hadjufi and she informed me that the whole delay is really about Versa Services, the company presently running the cafeteria.

Versa is thinking of renovating the entire cafeteria to make it more modern. But Deb thinks that Versa is all for the new coffee shop and that the administration is going through all this red tape for nothing, because they are concerned about the loss of business for Versa. If the cafeteria loses money on this venture, the school may have to raise tuition because much of the funding goes to the cafeteria. Nonetheless, the coffee shop may be in as soon as January 4. The enclosed survey will be beneficial in expressing how the students feel, so please fill it in and give it to one of the people listed.

When I first heard about Nine Inch Nails my friend casually mentioned that there was in fact only one 'Nail'. Why one person would name his act in the plural is strange to me. Nevertheless, Trent Reznor is Nine Inch Nails, and he literally wrote, performed and produced this whole disk.

The CD opens with an instrumental. This is different for a solo artist, but its not the longest or greatest song ever written. The next song, and nearly the whole album, is a mixture of a Ministry industrial sound and techno. Honestly, techno usually makes me want to puke, but the talent and diversity on this disk makes it better than just techno. The vocals and lyrics also pull this disk out of the techno genre. They try to tackle more worthy topics other than dance your ass off, like most techno.

The heavy guitar and well mixed drums are placed predominantly in the foreground. While some synthetic and electronic sounds are well in the background they only come forward periodically. After being trampled by the NAIT OOKS on November 5th at the Coliseum, the Concordia hockey team was referred to as a "let down" by the opposition. The NAIT newspaper wrote that Concordia might be in over their heads because they are not competitive enough to be in this league.

Overall, Concordia has not done poorly in the league. The Mustangs are the "New kids on the ice", and they did not attract too many Junior players this year. Only two players in the team have played Junior hockey and the rest of the team consists of athletes from triple A and midget hockey. NAIT on the other hand has been with the league for a number of years and they attract more Junior players than Concordia would in their first season in ACAC. Most people are still unaware of Concordia's involvement in the league. NAIT had their problems during their first

year in the league, but over time NAIT's hockey program became established and became highly recognized by many athletes. In years to come Concordia will reach that same calibre and hopefully attract more athletes to enroll in the college program.

The loss against NAIT did not hinder Concordia's performance against Grand Prairie Regional College on November 13th and 14th. Concordia played one of their best games so far in the season.

On Friday, November 13th, the Mustangs made a phenomenal comeback in the third period to almost tie the game. After two periods of play, GPRC was leading the game 6-1 and it seems as though Concordia was on its way to another defeat. But the third period was a totally new game for the Mustangs. They came out on the ice to play solid hockey for twenty minutes. GPRC did not get a single goal in the third period and Concordia scored four goals to narrow GPRC's lead by one goal. The Mustangs

almost tied the game, but time ran out. This was a great confidence builder for the team.

According to coach Jim McLean, Saturday's game was "the most rewarding game so far." The Mustangs did not get off to a good start. Two players were ejected early in the game due to penalties and the team had to play over half of the entire game with only two lines. The score was tied at 2-2 after the second period. Once again Concordia came alive in the third to score four goals and shut out GPRC due to some excellent saves by Kyle Brown. The final outcome was 6-2 Concordia. This marks the Mustangs first win of the season and the victory was "amazing and uplifting for everyone involved."

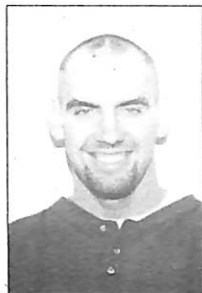

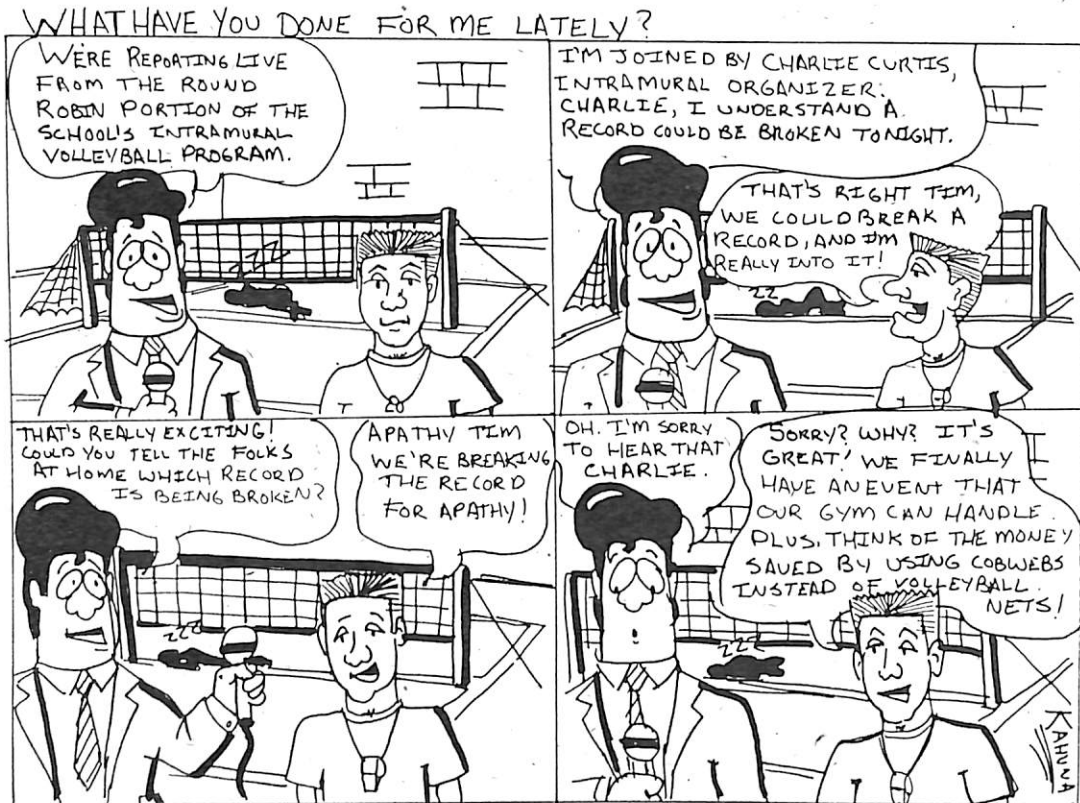
