Welcome and History

The Board of Regents, students, faculty, and staff of Concordia University College of Alberta extend a warm welcome to all who join us as we confer degrees and diplomas on members of the twentieth graduating class. We celebrate the achievements of this graduating class and give thanks as they join the growing number of Concordia alumni who are serving others with the academic and leadership skills they have attained.

This Convocation marks the end of a year of continued blessings and new developments in the life of Concordia. The new academic building, the Hole Academic Center, was dedicated on May 10, 2007. The first graduates in the Master of Information Systems Security Management program receive their parchments today. And on April 13, 2007, Dr. Gerald S. Krispin was elected as Concordia's seventh president; he succeeds Dr. Richard W. Kraemer, who enters retirement on July 1, 2007.

Concordia's work in developing leaders began in 1921, when the institution was founded to prepare young men for preaching and teaching ministries in the Lutheran church. In 1939, Concordia expanded to include women and to offer general courses of study and an accredited high school program. In 1967, Concordia began offering first-year university courses in affiliation with the University of Alberta. Today, Concordia offers three- and four-year bachelor of arts degrees, three- and four-year bachelor of science degrees, a four-year bachelor of management degree, a bachelor of education (after degree), a bachelor of environmental health (after degree), a master's degree in information systems security management, a director of parish services program and colloquy programs for the church, as well as extensive professional and continuing education programs. Concordia High School continues to operate on the Highlands campus.

Throughout its history, Concordia has remained grounded in the belief that the Christian faith gives purpose to life and that success depends upon spiritual maturity. Concordia fosters a Christian lifestyle on campus and encourages a dual commitment to academic excellence and religious vitality. An institution of Lutheran Church-Canada governed by an elected Board of Regents, Concordia has been shaped by the philosophy expressed in its motto: *Initium Sapientiae Timor Domini – The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.*

Academic Dress

The Academic Gown dates back to the twelfth century. While originally it may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, it has come to symbolize levels of academic scholarship with variations in sleeves and decorations representing degree levels.

The Academic Cap symbolizes the dignity and freedom of scholarship. The mortarboard (a square cap) represents a book. Gold bullion tassels indicate doctor's degrees.

The Academic Hood varies in both size and color. The colors of the silk lining of the hood are the colors of the institution granting the degree. Concordia's hoods are lined with blue and white. The color of the velvet edging indicates the academic discipline in which the degree has been earned. The color for arts is white, for management is drab, for science is gold, for education is blue, and for environmental health is salmon.

The Gold Cord indicates a degree earned with distinction or with high distinction.

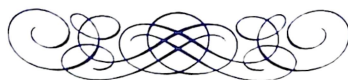
The Vice-President Academic & Provost presents the candidates with these words:

The Convocation Speaker

Mr. Martin Kratz was born in Edmonton, Alberta and lived as a young child close to the Northwest Territories. At the University of Alberta, he received his BSc (Engineering) degree with distinction in 1981, and then worked towards his Master's degree in Electrical Engineering before turning his attention and receiving a Bachelor of Law degree with distinction in 1984. He then did further post-graduate studies at the University of Heidelberg, Germany.

Martin has had a successful career as a lawyer, first with a local Edmonton law firm in the late 1980s and with Bennett Jones LLP since 1991. Martin is currently a partner and the Head of Intellectual Property Group of Bennett Jones LLP.

Besides running a successful practice, Martin has taught extensively at four different universities including teaching in two master's degree programs. He has been appointed as an Adjunct Professor, Law Lecturer, or Regional Director with the University of Alberta, Faculty of Law; Osgoode Hall Law School at York University (Toronto); the University of Calgary, Faculty of Law; and with Concordia University College of Alberta.

Martin is an active speaker with engagements across Canada and internationally dealing with topics such as privacy law, Internet law, technology law, patent and trademark law. During the late 1980s he chaired a world committee on computer security law. He has also published over 185 articles and books.

He is recognized internationally as a leading lawyer. Among other honours, he is identified as one of Canada's leading lawyers in *The LEXPERT/American Lawyer's Guide to the Leading 500 Lawyers in Canada*; by LEXPERT-Thomson in the 2006 US Guide to *Canada's 100 Most Creative Lawyers*; in Woodward White's 2006 inaugural edition of *The Best Lawyers in Canada*; as highly recommended in technology law by the *Practicing Law Institute*; as highly recommended by *Chambers and Partners* for intellectual property law; as a leading lawyer by Mondaq's *Guide to the World's Leading Internet and E-Commerce Advisors*.

Martin allows time in his busy schedule to creating or helping associations to further Alberta's science and technology community. As a co-founder, he continues active participation with the Alberta Science and Technology Leadership Foundation and its prestigious ASTech awards and gala promoting accomplishments in Alberta. He is also active in organizations like CIPS, InfoTech, WiTec and THECIS. As effectively the mayor, he is very active in his nationally recognized community, Elbow Valley, just outside of Calgary. He remains actively involved in Scouts Canada and is the recipient of scouting awards.

Martin makes time in his life for fun, and enjoys scuba diving, car racing, and touring and travel with his wife and children.

The Christo et Ecclesiae Award

Alvin Richard Borchardt was born to Rev. Alvin Otto and Anna (Ring) Borchardt in the family home in Langenburg, Saskatchewan on July 7, 1934. He attended grade school in Langenburg until he was fourteen and then, desiring to follow in the footsteps of his father and older brother, both pastors, received his high school and two years of college education at Concordia High School and Concordia College in St. Paul, Minnesota. In 1955 he enrolled at Concordia Lutheran Seminary in St. Louis.

Alvin met his wife, Jean (nee Kulpa), when he was attending Seminary in St. Louis. They became engaged in 1957 before he left for his vicarage year in Elgin, Illinois. Their wedding took place on August 17, 1958, at Marcus Lutheran Church in North St. Louis, with Jean's pastor officiating and Alvin's father preaching the sermonette.

Alvin was ordained by his father at Christ Lutheran Church in Langenburg on September 13, 1959. His first parish was at Connaught Hill Lutheran Church in Prince George, BC, where he served from 1959-1964. While there, he began serving missions in Vanderhoof and Telkwa to the west, as well as Quesnel to the south. In 1964 he accepted a call to congregations in MacNutt and Landestreu, Saskatchewan, where he served until 1973, and then moved on to Red Lake, Ontario, from 1973-1984. He next served as pastor at Christ Lutheran Church in Neepawa, Manitoba, from 1984 until his retirement in 1999, and has made his retirement home in this community because of his love for the people of Neepawa and nearby McCreary, where he also served the congregation of St. Paul Lutheran. His youngest daughter and her family live nearby.

During his ministry, Alvin served as Counselor for the Assiniboine, Portage, and Ontario Circuits, and he was a member of the Board of Directors of the Manitoba-Saskatchewan District for nine years. He has also served on various committees of both Synod and the District.

Alvin has a sister, Florence (Lowell) Braun of Morristown, Minnesota, and two brothers who are also pastors: Rev. Paul J. Borchardt of Roblin, Manitoba, and Rev. Carl (Darlene) Borchardt of Surrey, BC.

Alvin and Jean have six children: Alvin (Stephanie) of Balmertown (near Red Lake), Ontario; Brian (Lori) of Belle Plaines, Minnesota; Pamela (Rick) Chevrier of Marathon, Ontario; Rev. Harold (Annette) of Southey, Saskatchewan; James (Kelly) of Thunder Bay, Ontario; and Jeannette (Marshall) Dolding of Eden, Manitoba. They have been blessed with sixteen grandchildren.

Alvin and Jean are spending their retirement years in active involvement in church and community activities in Neepawa. They both adhere to the belief that if you are going to live in a community, you should become involved in the community!

The Christo et Ecclesiae Award

Harold David Harvey Haberstock entered the world in a home birth on the family farm in Churchbridge, Saskatchewan, on June 15, 1943. The youngest of Fred and Adele Haberstock's ten children (he has six sisters and three brothers), Harry began his education in a one-room country school. After a year spent boarding with a family in Churchbridge to begin high school, Harry enrolled at Concordia College in Edmonton, graduating in 1961. In 1963 he graduated from Concordia's junior college, having served as "Primus," the student body president. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia Senior College in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, in 1965, and then transferred to Concordia Lutheran Seminary in St. Louis. Following a year of vicarage at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Rockford, Illinois, he graduated with a Master of Divinity degree in 1969.

Harry's first call was to St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Creston, BC, and he has spent his entire ministry in this community. Very early in his pastorate, he was invited to help develop and celebrate the merger of three small Lutheran congregations from the Missouri and Lutheran Church in America Synods. He received a new call from the product of this amalgamation, Redeemer Lutheran Church, in 1971.

Harry was elected to the Alberta-British Columbia Board of Directors in the mid 80s and re-elected in 1994. In the late 80s he served as a Circuit Counselor in the BC Kootenay Circuit. Since 1997 he has served continuously as a District Vice President, and is currently Chair of the Task Force for the Care of Church Workers and their families. Throughout his ministry, he has maintained an active role in the Creston Valley Ministerial Association.

In 1986, Harry began Doctor of Ministry studies at St. Stephen's College in Edmonton under the supervision of Concordia's Dr. Adrian Leske. He was awarded the Doctor of Ministry degree in 1993.

Harry has been actively involved in health care in his community. He has served as a volunteer hospital chaplain, has taken an active role in the planning and building of a 40-bed care facility and a hospice, and is currently president of the Addiction Recovery Center in the Kootenays. He has been a member of Rotary International for twenty years. Harry was honored with the 'Citizen of the Year' award by the Creston Valley in 1990. Committed to healthy physical exercise throughout his thirty-eight years in Creston, Harry has been involved in running, swimming, curling, golfing, sailing, canoeing, and kayaking. He also has participated in minor hockey as a coach and referee.

Harry met his wife, Mary (Anderson), at his 'field work' church in St. Charles, Missouri, in 1967. They have been blessed with four children – Paul, Timothy, Sarah, and Jonathan – and ten grandchildren. They look forward to their 40th wedding anniversary in August, 2007.

The Distinguished Service Award

Arlen Lyle Salte is the son of Rev. Norman and Helen Salte. Born on April 15, 1956, in Melfort, Saskatchewan, Arlen moved with his family to Outlook, Saskatchewan, in 1960 where his father assumed the role of Dean of the Bible Department at the Lutheran Collegiate Bible Institute. A tragic car accident in 1963 took the life of Rev. Salte and resulted in years of struggle for Arlen with the concept of a loving God. It took a visit to his sister at the Canadian Lutheran Bible Institute in Camrose years later for Arlen to be drawn back to Christ through the love of God.

While attending Bible School at the Canadian Lutheran Bible Institute, Arlen received a call to launch a ministry which would share the Gospel in the context of the culture. Break Forth Ministries (formerly New Creation Ministries) was founded in 1977. Since that time, under Arlen's leadership, Break Forth Ministries has held over seven thousand outreaches throughout the world, including Canada, the United States, Mexico, Scandinavia, the Baltic Countries, Central America, and the West Indies. The ministry has also prepared hundreds of young people in worship and ministry arts in 10-month programs of training and practical ministry.

In 1995, Arlen began regional Break Forth worship workshops for the practical training of church musicians, technicians, and leaders. Over seven thousand praise team members have been trained across the United States and Canada in these weekend workshops.

In 1997, Arlen founded Break Forth Canada, an interdenominational equipping and renewal conference. This has grown to become the largest training event of its kind in North America, offering over 150 classes with overall attendance approaching fifteen thousand.

In addition to his role as Executive Director of Break Forth Ministries, Arlen has sold over one-quarter of a million albums in multiple styles, has had several radio hits (as high as #1 in major markets in the USA), and has produced the Everybody Sing children's CDs, which are the top-selling Canadian Christian children's series ever released. As a writer, he has published in many journals and magazines, has served as the worship columnist for *Strategies for Today's Leader* magazine, and has co-authored the books *Times of Refreshing* and *Break Forth Manual*. In the broadcast realm, he has appeared many times on international television, as a main character in a feature length movie, and as the featured artist of a CBC national radio special. He has served as a keynote speaker in several countries around the world to audiences as large as ten thousand.

Arlen and his wife, Elsa, along with their three children – Linnea, Brennan, and Jared – are active members of Bethel Lutheran Church in Sherwood Park, Alberta.

The Distinguished Alumni Award

Douglas A. Goebel was born on April 14, 1941, on a farm south of Stony Plain, Alberta. In 1951, the family moved into Stony Plain, where Doug attended St. Matthew Lutheran School for grades 4 through 9. He entered Concordia College in 1957, graduating with a senior matriculation high school diploma in 1960. At Concordia, Doug was involved in a variety of activities including junior and senior basketball, the drama club, the Aurora Borealis (the school paper), the yearbook advertising team, the men's dorm council, and the male chorus.

From 1976-1982, Doug took courses through the University of Alberta's Faculty of Extension, receiving a Certificate of Management Development in May, 1982. In April, 1961, Doug commenced a thirty-five year career with Alberta Treasury Branches (now ATB Financial). He was employed in a variety of locations – Wetaskiwin, Coronation, Ft. McLeod, Drayton Valley, Falher, Killiam, Leduc – before being transferred to Head Office in Edmonton in 1979, where he worked as Credit Supervisor, Corporate Accounts Manager, General Manager, and Assistant Superintendent. He retired as Executive General Manager, Edmonton General Office, the regional office to 78 branches north of Lacombe, after thirty-five years of service with ATB.

Doug has always been active in the communities in which he lived, and has participated in many organizations and activities, including member of the Boy Scouts Group Committee; coach for Ladies Fastball; member of golf and curling clubs in five communities; member of the Kinsmen Club in three communities; member of the Board of Trade or Chamber of Commerce in five communities; member of the Lions Club in three communities; volunteer fireman in two communities; and as a board member for the Killiam General Hospital and Killiam Medical Center and the Leduc Fine Arts Scholarship Foundation.

Doug has been a member of St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Leduc since 1976, where he has served on the Board of Elders, the Board of Stewardship, and as a congregational financial reviewer and church extension representative. He was a volunteer leader at his congregation for Concordia's Cornerstone of Excellence fundraising campaign.

Doug has been involved with Faith Lutheran School since 2003 as a member of the Finance Committee, a Science Fair judge, a member of the charity golf tournament's organizing committee, and a volunteer for Faith's annual Carnival.

In 1973 Doug married Rochelle Tessier, who was called to be with her Lord in December, 2002. Their daughter, Kim, graduated from Concordia in 1999 with a Bachelor of Arts degree, which she followed up with a Bachelor of Education (After Degree) in 2002. She is now a teacher at Faith Lutheran School.

The Judith C. Meier Excellence in Teaching Award

Richard William Kraemer was born to William and Bernice Kraemer in Chicago Heights, Illinois, on January 7, 1942. An honor student in high school, Richard entered Valparaiso University in 1960, and in 1964 received an Honors BA in Philosophy. Encouraged by Valpo's president, Dr. O.P. Kretzmann, to seek admission to a graduate program at Cambridge University in England, Richard graduated from Cambridge with an MA in 1966. He then pursued his goal of studying for the pastoral ministry by attending Concordia Lutheran Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, from 1966 to 1969. He graduated with an MDiv in 1969, and began further graduate work with the goal of eventually teaching on the university level.

In 1969, Richard was called to serve as pastor of Heavenly Host Lutheran Church in Cookeville, Tennessee, where he also served as campus pastor to Tennessee Tech University. He continued his graduate studies while there, receiving an STM degree from the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago in 1974.

Richard received a call to serve as Assistant Professor of Religious Studies and Spiritual Life Coordinator from Concordia Edmonton in November, 1977, and arrived in Edmonton with his wife, Janet (Homeier), whom he met and married during his vicarage year in Indianapolis in 1968, and their children, Jonathan and Cheryl. Their second daughter, Rebekah, was born in Edmonton a few months later.

Richard loved teaching. He began with a course in Christianity and Contemporary Issues, and soon developed a new course on the Theology of Luther. While serving as Chair of the Religious Studies Division from 1982-1989, he developed another course in Professional Ethics. In 1988 he became Vice-President Student Services, and then served as Interim President in 1990-1991. He was elected as Concordia's sixth president in 1991, a position he has held since that time, while continuing to teach on and off through the years. He completed his doctorate from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis in 1998.

Richard has been most grateful for the opportunity to engage the lives of thousands of students during his thirty-year career of teaching and serving students at Concordia. He has found students endlessly interesting, challenging, and open to discussing the important issues of life while engaging their faith in the process. He has also been immensely grateful to be part of a team of dedicated Christian faculty members and administrators who have helped to make Concordia University College an astonishing success story.

Richard and Janet are both retiring from Concordia at the close of this academic year. Members of Bethel Lutheran Church in Sherwood Park, they will take up residence in that community where they will be near their children and five grandchildren – Benjamin, Anna, Zachary, Amy, and Kelly.

Richard is the third recipient of the Judith C. Meier Excellence in Teaching Award.
