



Terry is Mi'kmaq / Acadian, in his 43rd year of marriage to Bev. They have three adult children. He holds a PhD in Intercultural Studies from Asbury Theological Seminary, specializing in Theology, Mission and Anthropology. He is founding Chair and current Director of NAIITS: An Indigenous Learning Community (http://www.naiits.com).

Terry serves as adjunct faculty for Acadia Divinity College, George Fox and Tyndale Seminaries in Theology and Mission, and at Tyndale University College where he resources the B.Ed. program. He has accrued 37 years of work in the Native North American and global Indigenous context including as an educator in formal theological and community development training.

Author of numerous articles, theological papers and assorted book chapters, Terry has won several awards for his varied writings. In June 2010, for his work on the creation of NAIITS, Terry became the 28th recipient of the Dr. E.H. Johnson Memorial Award for Innovation in Mission.
