#### **Concordia Bursary Assistance**

#### **Concordia Bursary Program**

Students experiencing financial difficulties while attending Concordia may apply for bursary assistance. A Concordia bursary is non-repayable financial assistance awarded to domestic and international students on the basis of financial need. Students are expected to make plans for funding their education through primary sources such as personal and family savings, scholarships and awards, and employment earnings. A bursary is meant to supplement, not replace, other financial assistance. The program is funded by both Concordia University College and private donors.

#### Am I eligible?

Demonstrate financial need based on a modest standard of living Be enrolled in an undergraduate degree program Be registered full-time (minimum 60% of a full-course load) Have achieved satisfactory academic standing on their most recent course work

Have not previously declared bankruptcy or defaulted on a student loan, including the Concordia Emergency Loan

#### **Application Process**

To apply for bursary assistance, students must complete and submit an online application form by the October 15th deadline. In addition, students must submit all supporting documentation to the Student and Enrolment Services office by the deadline. Go to **Services for Students** on the Concordia website and click on "Online Award Applications".

#### SCHOLARSHIPS FOR GRADUATE STUDIES

#### What is an Alexander Graham Bell Canada Graduate Scholarship?

NSERC (Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council) provides financial support to high caliber scholars who are engaged in master's programs in the natural sciences or engineering. This support allows these scholars to fully concentrate on their studies and to seek out the best research mentors in their chosen fields. NSERC encourages interested and qualified Aboriginal students to apply.

#### Are you eligible for scholarship support?

To be considered eligible for support, as of the application deadline date, you must:

Be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada;

Hold, or expect to hold (at the time you take up the award), a degree in science or engineering from a university whose standing is acceptable to NSERC;

Intend to pursue in the following year full-time graduate studies and research at the master's level in an eligible program in one of the areas of the natural sciences and engineering supported by NSERC; and

Have obtained a first-class average (a grade of "A-") in each of the last two completed years of study (full-time equivalent)

#### What is the scholarship value?

A Canada Graduate Scholarship is \$17,500 for one year.

#### How do I apply?

Concordia students interested in applying for an NSERC Canada Graduate Scholarship will need to complete Form 201. Applicants should visit the NSERC website at <a href="http://www.nserc-crsng.gc.ca/">http://www.nserc-crsng.gc.ca/</a> for the electronic application form and further information on the scholarship.

Applicants must submit an electronic application form by Concordia's deadline.

#### When is Concordia's deadline?

The deadline is November 15, 2010. Applicants should allow adequate time to complete the application process.



# **Library News**

#### A New Library Notice is coming that will help you avoid Fines!

If you have an item checked out of the library the schedule of email notices you receive is as follows:

A "Heads Up" notice 3 days before the item is due

A "1st overdue" notice the day after the item is due

A "2nd overdue" notice 7 days after the due date

An "Assumed Lost" notice 31 days after the due date Soon a new notice will be added to this list. You will receive a notice on the day that the item is due, giving you the opportunity to renew or return the item that day and avoid the \$1.00/day fine. The "1st overdue" notice will move to 2 days after the item is due. Just remember to renew or return items on time - the best way to do that is to check your student email daily for library notices.

You can renew your own items from "My Account" on the library website <a href="http://library.concordia.ab.ca/services/myaccount.php">http://library.concordia.ab.ca/services/myaccount.php</a>. You can also visit or phone the Circulation Desk to renew.

If you have any questions about notices, fines or renewals just ask at the Circulation Desk.

Doing research for your latest assignment? Need more than what you can find on the shelves of Concordia's Library? Did you know that you can request books and articles from other libraries through our library catalogue? The Concordia Library is a member of the NEOS Consortium, which includes the University of Alberta libraries, Alberta Government libraries, and other academic libraries across Alberta. Visit the library homepage at <a href="http://library.concordia.ab.ca">http://library.concordia.ab.ca</a> to search WorldCat and select the items that you need to read. Materials are usually delivered in under five business days and can be picked up from the Circulation Desk. Any questions? Just consult a library staff member who will be happy to walk you through the request process.
