WHY ATTEND A CAREER FAIR: EVEN WHEN YOU DON'T THINK YOU SHOULD

Career and job fairs happening frequently in the city, and mostly free, but those should not be reasons to take them for granted. On the contrary, you should attend several career fairs a year, whether you have a job or not. Here are 5 reasons why:



Practice Confidence



A career fair is a shopping mall for career prospects and connections, and confidence is the currency of the day. Not only are employers and organizations vying for the brightest candidates, you have the opportunity to sell yourself to your "buyer" of choice. To do this, you need to confidently deliver an elevator pitch and

share your skills, experience and aspirations. Attend several career fairs and practice looking people eye to eye, shaking hands confidently, overall body posture and speaking fluently in professional manner. Study the body language of the most successful networker in the room; pick cues from their posture, dress, sense and speech. Practice making your brand the most desirable in the room. Reconnaissance

workplace culture and atmosphere, are all potent weapons in your arsenal when eventually writing resumes, cover letters and heading to interviews. Start a conversation with a stranger, you may meet someone who is looking to vacate a position they currently occupy which you might be interested in filling. Exchange business cards, emails or LinkedIn details. Career related conversations can continue even after the career fair ends. Great friends and associates can be made if you approach a job fair with a social networking mindset.

Be Inspired



Feeling down because you are unsure about your future or are currently unemployed? Perhaps you are ready to move on from your current place of work. A career fair might just be the right dose of inspiration to get your productivity juices flowing again. Charitable Donations

It was reported that recently on campus an individual requested donations for the Philippines. In most cases, a person or group, may be representing a legitimate organization; however, it's always best to ask those involved for some identification or documentation as proof of that involvement.

If you are approached on campus to contribute to a charity, and are in doubt, please ask the individual to report to the Student Life Office located in HA 114. Student Life staff will take steps to verify the credibility of the persons representing that charity. Requests for *cash donations* should be viewed as suspect- especially without a receipt!

Many of us are filled with a desire to help others; unfortunately, fraudulent charities often emerge to try to scam donations from well-meaning Canadians. To avoid scams or having your dollars misdirected, donors would do well to plan their giving and demand accountability of the organizations soliciting their support.

If you plan to donate money, whether it's for those in need or for another cause close to your heart, the Better Business Bureau offers the following advice:

Think before you give. Door-to-door solicitations for donations are common, but when an unfamiliar organization comes knocking, don't give without gathering details.

Giving later might be better. Never feel pressured to give on the spot. Legitimate charities will welcome your money tomorrow.

Be cautious when giving online. Be cautious about online giving, especially in response to messages and emails that claim to link to a charitable organization, in particular with those linked to disaster relief. In the days following the Japanese earthquake and tsunami, several phony charitable websites popped up alleging to help victims.

Watch out for charity fraud. Legitimate charities do not demand donations; they willingly provide written information about their programs, finances or how donations are used; and they never insist you provide your credit card number, bank account number or any other personal information.

Tax receipts. If you want to make a tax-deductible donation, only a registered charity has a Registration Number from the Canada Revenue Agency and can issue donation receipts for gifts



Get Connected!


It's that time of year again....it's time for CPA's Get Connected! Event.
