Welcome and History

The Board of Regents, students, faculty and staff of Concordia College extend a warm welcome to all who join us today for the conferring of degrees to our second graduating class.

Concordia College was founded on October 31, 1921, for the purpose of preparing young men for the preaching and teaching ministries of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. In 1939, co-education, general courses of study, and an accredited high school program were introduced to broaden the purpose of the school.

The College was affiliated with the University of Alberta on the first year college level in 1967. In 1975, the affiliation was extended to include second year courses. On July 16, 1987, Concordia College was designated as an institution that may grant three-year Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees by Order in Council of the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Alberta.

The College is owned and operated by The Lutheran Church-Canada, and is governed by an elected Board of Regents.

The philosophy of the institution is espoused in its motto: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom."

"Follow the Upward Call of God" is the theme for the 1988-1989 academic year. It is based on Philippians 3:14, "So I run straight toward the goal in order to win the prize, which is God's call through Christ Jesus to the life above."

Academic Dress

The ACADEMIC GOWN dates back to the twelfth century. While it originally may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, it has come to symbolize levels of academic scholarship with variations in sleeves and decorations representing degree levels.

The ACADEMIC CAP symbolizes the dignity and freedom of scholarship. The mortarboard (a square cap) represents a book. Tassel colors may vary according to the wearer's major area of study. Gold bullion tassels indicate doctor's degrees.

The ACADEMIC HOOD varies both in size and color. The colors of the silk lining of the hood are the colors of the institution granting the degree. The hoods of Concordia College are lined with blue and white, the school colors. The color of the velvet edging indicates the academic discipline in which the degree has been earned. The color for arts is white and the color for science is gold.

The GOLD CORD indicates a degree earned with distinction or with high distinction.

Degrees with Distinction: The notation "With Distinction" is inscribed on the permanent record of a candidate who obtains a grade point average between 7.5 and 8.4 or higher in meeting the degree requirements of the program.

Degrees with High Distinction: The notation "With High Distinction" is inscribed on the permanent record of a candidate who obtains a grade point average of 8.5 or higher in meeting the degree requirements of the program.

The Convocation Speaker

Rev. Dr. Edwin Lehman is the first president of The Lutheran Church-Canada, which gained autonomy from The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod following its founding convention in Winnipeg, Manitoba, in May, 1988.

Dr. Lehman is an alumnus of both Concordia's high school and college. He completed his training at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, graduating in 1956 with a M.Div. degree. He served congregations in Margo, Wadena and Nut Mountain, Saskatchewan, Red Deer, Craig and Alhambra, Alberta, and Richmond, British Columbia, before his election as President of the Alberta-British Columbia District in 1978. He was a member of Concordia's Board of Regents from 1979-1988, serving as its Chairman from 1981.

Dr. Lehman was a driving force in the founding of Concordia Lutheran Seminary, and has held numerous administrative positions within the Church. For his outstanding leadership, his alma mater (Concordia Seminary, St. Louis) granted him an honorary doctorate in May, 1987.

His ministry and church leadership have been characterized by a pastoral approach combined with theological astuteness. He has contributed many devotional articles to church journals.

Dr. Lehman is married to Marjorie nee Huber of Indian Head, Saskatchewan. Their three children — Rod, Barbara and Katherine — are all Concordia College alums. Barbara is one of today's graduates!

The Distinguished Service Award Recipient

The Distinguished Service Award recognizes exceptional service to the Church, to Concordia College, and/or to society in general. The Board of Regents has chosen to honor Mr. Gilbert Berdahl of Drumheller, Alberta, with this special award for 1989.

An alum, Gil Berdahl came to Concordia College by train from Estevan, Saskatchewan, as a twelve-year old in 1926. Concordia's high school began at the Grade 9 level in those days, and he remained to complete Grade 12 in 1930.

Since the Depression made earning a living in southern Saskatchewan a bleak prospect, Mr. Berdahl returned to Alberta in 1932. His enthusiasm for sports (especially baseball) led him to the Drumheller area, the home of the then Alberta Provincial Senior Baseball champions. He found work on local farms and occasionally in coal mining services. Following his marriage to Peggy Sember in 1938, Mr. Berdahl began farming the land where the couple still make their home.

A long list of accomplishments in leadership positions in the church and community bear witness to Mr. Berdahl's distinguished service. As a church leader wrote in congratulating Mr. Berdahl, "... what a wonderful gift of the Lord our good lay people are, and how important their work for the Lord is. You are one of these people of God."

Gil and Peggy Berdahl raised a family of three daughters and two sons, and last December celebrated their fifty-first wedding anniversary.
