The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui is a play by the German dramatist <u>Bertolt Brecht</u>, originally written in 1941. It chronicles the rise of Arturo Ui, a fictional '30s <u>Chicago mobster</u>, and his attempts to control the <u>cauliflower racket</u> by ruthlessly disposing of the opposition. The play is a highly <u>satirical allegory</u> of <u>Adolf Hitler</u> in <u>Nazi Germany</u>, whose rise Brecht represents in parallel to that of Ui. All the characters and groups in the play have direct counterparts in real life, with Ui representing Hitler, his henchman Ernesto Roma representing <u>Ernst Röhm</u>, Dogsborough representing <u>Paul von Hindenburg</u> (a pun on the German *Hund* and *Burg*), Emanuele Giri representing <u>Hermann Göring</u>, the Cauliflower Trust representing the <u>Prussian Junkers</u>, the fate of the town of Cicero standing for the <u>Anschluss</u> in <u>Austria</u> and so on. In addition, every scene in the play is based on a real event, for example the warehouse fire which represents the fire at the <u>Reichstag</u>. The play is similar to the film <u>The Great Dictator</u> (1940), which features an absurd parody of Hitler by <u>Charlie Chaplin</u>. All the roles will be open to male or female actors.

"I wrestled with reality for forty years, and I am happy to state that I finally won out over it." Everyone wants to meet Elwood Dowd and his friend Harvey. When they enter a room, strangers soon become friends and people want to share a drink with them. But Harvey is a six-foot invisible rabbit and Elwood's sister wants him gone. The question is – does the world need another "normal" chap, or more Harveys? This Pulitzer Prize-winning play by Mary Chase was made famous by Jimmy Stewart's portrayal of the loveable Elwood Dowd in the 1950 film. The play was a huge hit this past season at the Shaw Festival in Niagara on the Lake.
