24-hour Study Space Now Available

Beginning this coming Monday, November 1, Concordia will provide its students with 24 hour access to its cafeteria for the purposes of study and relaxation. (No food service will be available after hours.)

The doors of the cafeteria will be unlocked as long as the main areas of the campus are open—normally from 0600 to 2200 daily. Students

already in the cafeteria at the time the doors are locked will be permitted to remain, so long as they present a valid Concordia University College identification card.

To gain access to the cafeteria after the doors are locked, students may contact Security at 780-479-8761, or 5555 from an internal phone.

Access will be granted through the north doors of Founders Hall. Students must present a valid CUCA identification card to be granted entry.

Surveillance cameras will be in operation and images will be recorded. No alcohol or drugs will be permitted. Intoxicated people will be denied access. Security will patrol the cafeteria as part of their regular routine. To enable students to read and study effectively, free from unreasonable noise and other distractions, students are asked to respect the needs of others sharing the space as well as the needs of

residents in close proximity. Sleeping overnight will not be permitted.
