INTERNATIONAL/ INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

If you are considering a summer overseas, explore and start planning now because deadlines for internship opportunities are coming up. Take time before Christmas to explore:

1. University of Alberta – Experience China from Within – Spring, 2011 – Course in China

- This course is open to all senior undergraduates in all faculties. The course is designed to help students build their knowledge of and experience with China and its people through engagements within China's cultural, social, educational and business fabrics. Each student will also be paired for one week with a home Chinese department of his/ her choice to gain insights into the student's academic major.

2. Alberta Smithsonian Internship (ASIP)

- ASIP offers students "a chance to experience history (Vue, 2009)" and the opportunity to gain international work experience in their field of study. Each year, the ASIP is committed to funding 10 interns, either at the Smithsonian complex in Washington DC (not to be confused with the Washington Centre) or at one of its several affiliated sites, with internships ranging from 2 months to a maximum of 4 months between May and December each year.

3. Alberta- Saxony Internship Program – Germany

The Terry Fox Humanitarian Award Program (\$7,000 per year for a maximum of four years) was established in 1982 to encourage the benevolence of young Canadians and to recognize humanitarian volunteer work. There is no set discipline students must study in order to receive the award, but they must continuously demonstrate a



strong performance in academics, athletics and volunteerism. The deadline for this prestigious awards program is February 1, 2011. The Peter Elzinga Family Foundation Scholarships

The Peter Elzinga Family Foundation was established for the purpose of awarding Educational Scholarships which are intended to promote the advancement of education and to provide an incentive and means for anyone to continue learning.

Library News

Renewal Tips

- For your convenience, library reminders are sent out three (3) days prior to your due date as well as on the day an item is due.
- You can renew online using My Account http://library.concordia.ab.ca/services/myaccount.php or in person.
- If you are having any problems renewing online, please phone (780-479-9338) or email (circle@concordia.ab.ca) the library *immediately*. If we are closed, leave a message and library staff will take care of your renewal so that you don't accumulate fines. Please give us your name as it appears on your student ID card, your barcode number and a phone number to contact you if we need further information.
- If you wait to contact us and your items become overdue, you will accumulate fines at \$1 per day per item.

Hold Shelf Tips

- If you have placed an item on hold you will receive an email as soon as it becomes available. You will need to pick up the item by the date given in the email.
- You will find your item on the **Hold Shelf** just past the Circulation Desk. Your item will have a flag that has the first three (3) letters of your last name and the last four (4) digits of your barcode number (the 13 digit number located underneath the barcode on your student ID card).
- The item isn't checked out to you yet so you must bring it to the Circulation Desk to be checked out using your student ID card. If you don't need the item any longer, please give it to the staff member on duty so they can remove the hold and send the item back to the owning library.
- **WARNING!** Items only remain on the hold shelf for five (5) days before being sent back to the owning library. To avoid disappointment it's a good idea to check your student email daily if you are waiting for a hold.
- If you have been waiting a long time for a hold, come see us at the Circulation Desk. We can investigate to determine why it's taking so long. If an item is missing or assumed lost you might need to choose other sources. Staff at the Information Desk can help you with finding other sources.
