Christo Et Ecclesiae Award

The Christo Et Ecclesiae Award is presented annually by the Board of Regents of Concordia College to an individual whose life has exemplified commitment to Christ and His Church. This year's recipient is Rev. Lester H.E. Gierach of Edmonton, who retired in 1987 following twenty years of service to the Alberta-British Columbia District as its Executive Secretary.

Pastor Gierach was born in Thiensville, Wisconsin, and received his post-secondary education at Concordia College, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, graduating in 1946. Following a vicarage in Janesville, Wisconsin, he began his ministry at the Fairview-Hines Creek Parish in Alberta. He then accepted calls to congregations in Victoria and Cloverdale, B.C., before joining the District Office staff as Executive Secretary in 1967. Zion Lutheran School in Cloverdale was founded during Pastor Gierach's ministry.

Les Gierach consistently provided leadership to Alberta-British Columbia District congregations, both to new ones being established and older parishes experiencing difficulties of one sort or another. He was instrumental in assisting congregations to become financially selfsupporting, especially through his teaching of the "David Plan." Though retired, Pastor Gierach continues to serve the Church as a vacancy pastor for Bethany Lutheran congregation in Fort Saskatchewan.

There are five Gierach children: Lester (Beijing, China); Gloria McQueen (Chicago); Leonard (Edmonton); Raymond (Detroit); Lynette Willie (Edmonton).
