

WRITING CENTRE



The Writing Centre is a free service that provides support for teaching and learning through writing for all Concordia students, staff and faculty. Throughout the academic year we will offer the following range of services designed to promote learning through writing.

One-on-one consultations: students will book an appointment to receive individual feedback from an experienced instructor. Appointments will be one hour in length and are booked by placing your name in the desired time slot on the sign-up sheet on the door of room HA 115.

Drop-in hours: at busy times of the year, the Writing Centre will also offer drop-in appointments. These appointments will be only twenty minutes long.

Writing seminars: group seminars focusing on many aspects of writing at university, including essay writing, lab reports, thesis statements, referencing, introductions and conclusions, grammar and style, and more.

In-class presentations: designed to support in-class assignments tailored to a specific course requirement.

The staff of the Writing Centre do not edit or proofread papers, but teach students how to edit and proofread their own work. Staff do not comment on the accuracy of facts or suggest factual content and will not guarantee or predict a passing mark or specific letter grade. Responsibility for work rests with the student.
