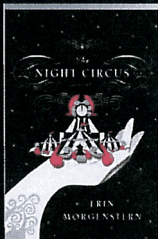

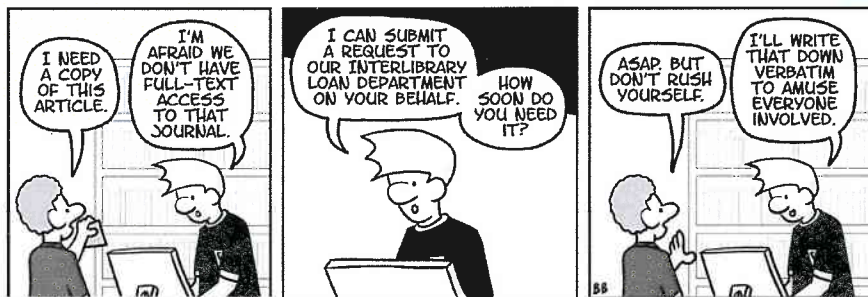

March is Women's History Month. **April** is Poetry Month.

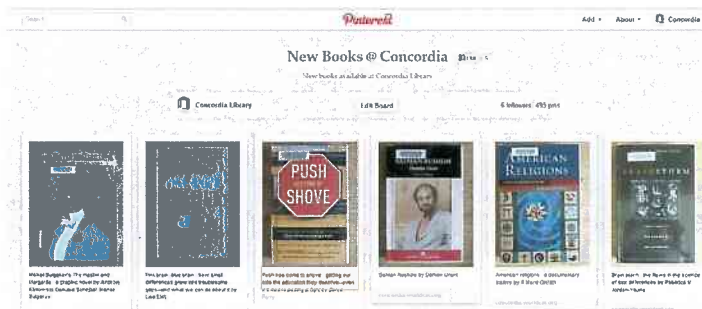

We no longer have the big black binder with printed lists of what's on Reserve but lists are available on WorldCat. <http://bit.ly/157yhPC>

- ◇ The loan period for DVDs has changed from 1 week to 2 weeks, which means if you need a DVD to show in class it might not be readily available. We encourage you to borrow the DVD earlier than you need it and we can extend the loan period if it is for classroom use. You could also put the DVD on Reserve to ensure it's available when you need it.
