



Campus Lost and Found

Lost Items

Students looking for lost items can visit the Library Circulation Desk during hours of operation or contact Concordia Security staff after library hours of operation.

If the item is not at the Library Circulation Desk, students can check the public lost and found bins located in the library near the main floor copiers, or near the CSA Offices.

Found Items

Bring all found items to the closest public service point on campus.

Service staff will mark any items turned in with a date on a sticky note and make an attempt to contact the owner if possible.

After a reasonable attempt has been made, or the item's owner cannot be determined, items will be brought to the library front desk.

Library staff will post descriptions and/or photos of items to Facebook.

Items with a value over \$250 will only be described generically and owners will need to identify the object and provide Concordia or government issued photo identification to claim items. Name, date, time, and verified id needs to be recorded upon claim.

Items with value of less than \$250 left unclaimed for 30 days will be placed in public lost and found bins (one in the library, one outside CSA conference room).

Campus keys should be returned to Sharlene. Other keys, cell phones and/or other items of a sensitive nature will be given to security to dispose of appropriately.

Items with a value greater than \$250 will be given to and managed by Concordia Security Services staff in accordance with the "Unclaimed Personal Property and Vested Property Act". Andrew Sterne and Sharlene Millang-Borst will document and maintain Concordia's compliance with this legislation.
