















The Northlands Park 1 Mile Road Race Friday June 3rd, 2011

- the date of high school graduation and the school from which sha or he graduated
- a summary of work experience
- a summary of extra-curricular activities
- a summary of community involvement in the Tri-Municipal area
- 1 letter of support from an instructor at her or his school of study
- 2 letters of support from individuals in the Tri-Municipal area who must address each of the following: applicant's entrepreneurial skills, academic abilities, leadership and/or community involvement
- a signed acknowledgement and authorization of application (shown below).
