A REGISTRAR'S WORK IS NEVER DONE

still work to be
done at the registrar's office. For
example, during

the first week of classes many students add or drop courses. One of the most common complaint is limited course space. At the time of registration many students are told that a particular course is full, however, during the first five days of the semester you might have a chance to take the class you want, providing the space is available and you have the appropriate prerequisete. So if there is a course you want to take next semester, or want to change your schedule, you would have from January 3 to January 9 to make the changes.

Another common problem is dropping courses. The deadline for dropping a course has already passed, but if you enrolled in a course and are finding it increasingly difficult to continue, you may withdraw from the course. If you withdraw from now until November 10, no mark will be shown on your transcript for that course. If you withdraw after November 11, withdrew failing (WF) will be shown on your transcript.

Anyone interested in transferring to another institution can find calenders, contact numbers and a free guide available as well. In addition, the registrar's office has planners to help with course selection, requirements and general information.

There are also special help sessions held in the fall and the spring to students. No dates have been set yet.

Much of this information is in the calendar and the agenda book, however if you still have any questions stop by the registrar's office or make an appointment. After all they are there to help you.





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
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
