We are currently recruiting students interested in becoming Peer Helpers as part of a brand new Peer Support Program 2017/2018!

Peer Support Program is Concordia's initiative to strengthen a community of support among students! It will provide students with a safe and confidential space to talk about life's problems with Peer Helpers who are trained listeners.

Peer Helpers will be expected to allocate a set time every week to have confidential one-on-one conversations with peers and also attend student events addressing mental health and wellness topics. This position requires a minimum commitment of 3 hours per week (maximum 5) for the fall and winter semesters.

Five successful candidates will be required to partake in 22 hours of intensive training in supportive listening and risk management prior to starting. Training will be held weeknights starting September 25th. Peer Helpers will also receive ongoing support from Concordia's Student Life Counsellor.

How to apply

As a Peer Helper, Peer Support Program offers you (1) real life skills and practical experience, (2) a boost to your Co-Curricular Record, resume and potential grad application, (3) preps you for your future profession. If this opportunity is of interest to you, please con-

tact peersupport@concordia.ab.ca with the subject heading "Expression of interest". Include your resume and a brief introduction with a clear rationale as to (1) why you want to volunteer for this program; (2) why you think you would be a good fit; (3) what your vision of mental health awareness and peer support looks like. Recruitment will close as soon as all positions are filled. Selected students will be invited to a more in depth conversation about their suitability, availability and commitment to the program. Successful applicants will be required to do a Criminal Records Check (cost reimbursed).





The research lab 'mieletec' is offering an internship for 2018. 'Mieletec' is a longstanding cooperation between the Faculty of Engineering Sciences and Mathematics of the University of Applied Sciences Bielefeld and the household appliance producer Miele & Cie. KG.

Miele & Cie. KG is a global player with its head office in North-West Germany and is successfully represented in 47 countries by company-owned sales organizations and in about 50 additional countries via importers.

'Mieletec' conducts applied research on prospective household appliances working closely together on concrete projects with Miele & Cie. KG. The objective is knowledge development in the fields of electrodynamics, thermodynamics, and fluid mechanics for household appliances to improve resource efficiency and benefit the potential end-user. Students get the opportunity for a practical training to strengthen their profile and to gain work experience in Germany.

Knowledge of German is desirable, but not necessary. The internship will take place in Bielefeld, Germany. Whether the internship will be paid depends on different factors e.g. the intern's skills. It is also possible to write a degree thesis during the internship.

Requirements:

- Student of Electrical Engineering, Computer Sciences, Mathematics, Physics, or similar.
- Preferably advanced year of study.
- Interest in doing applied research in the above-mentioned fields.
- Basic German language knowledge is of advantage, but not necessary.
