INTERNATIONAL STUDENT INFORMATION

Alberta Health Care

Concordia is offering two opportunities for international students to apply for Alberta Health Care on Campus.

A registry agent, is coming to Concordia University to assist and accept applications for an Alberta Health Care Card. There will be a table set up outside of the CSA offices located in Alumni Hall on the following dates:

- Thursday Sept. 12 from 10 a.m. 12:30 p.m.
- Friday Sept. 20, from 10 a.m. 12:30 p.m.

International Students will need to bring the following with them:

- Passport
- Study Permit
- Registration Confirmation
- Proof of Address: This can be found on their acceptance letter; on a bill; lease agreement etc.

Alberta Health care cards will be processed and mailed out to the students from the registry agent within 5 - 10 days after application. There is no fee for this service.

Alberta Identification Card

Interested students, can also apply for an Alberta Identification Card.

Getting as Alberta Identification Card would be a valid form of government I.D. as an alternative to carrying around their passports. There is a small fee for this ID card and it is dependent on the students Study Permit. It would cost approximately \$14.50 for a one year Alberta ID card, and approximately \$25 for a two year ID card. This is not a requirement, but simply a suggestion for convenience.

The play is simultaneously comic and tragic as it explores the intertwined lives of these four artists and the other people who live and work at Arkadina'a country home.

The question of how a good God can create a world in which evil exists is a perennial philosophical and religious problem. In several works Catholic philosopher Jacques Maritain (1889-1973) appropriated the thought of Augustine and Aquinas to present an innovative synthesis to address this problem. Maritain aims to preserve the delicate balance between human freedom and the fundamental priority of God's causal initiative in the line of good through grace. However, he argues that in the line of evil, it is the free creature that has the entire initiative, arguing provocatively that evil entails that the power of human freedom extends to the "annihilation" of the Divine action within the free agent. To commit evil is to destroy God's work that is already taking place within us. The paper intends to show the reasons that led Maritain to this view and the way in which his resolution preserves the balance between human freedom and God's priority and transcendence better than the typical competing views.


MANAGER WANTED: FOR THUNDER WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Job Searching? Don't Just Sit There: Network!

As a student, you are in the driver's seat when it comes to reaching out to your future employer: you don't want a job just yet and the job search pressure is off (for now). However, there are things you can be doing now to find the right job once you're ready for it. Enter: the Information Interview.

Information Interviews are all about gathering information from professionals already doing the work you want to do, and learning valuable information about the industry, career prospects and companies. Information Interviews also allow you to become known to employers.

Many jobs are not advertised. That's because they are being filled by people the employers already know. So, do yourself a favour and reach out to employers BEFORE they hire. You are actually doing them a favour if you do. Posting jobs and recruiting employees can be costly to employers. If the employer already knows you, they can simply call you when a job becomes available. Win/win!

Below are tips on how to conduct an information interview:

- · Find employers you want to work for
- Create a script of what you'll say when they answer the phone (think of it being a 10 second
- elevator pitch: what would you say to them in the time it takes to ride an elevator with them
- · Write questions beforehand
- Make the call. When you call, make sure you are calling someone who is doing the work you want
 to be doing one day, not their assistant, or support staff. Remember, you are NOT asking them for
 a job. You simply want information about their career/industry/company.
 - ⇒ Grumpy response from the person you called? Ask if there is a better time to talk. If a person seems rude, try not to take it personally. It could be anything making them miserable. Call the next person.
- Follow up on any leads you may get.
- Thank the person for their time and let them know you will call them back in a month or so.
- Ask if you can send a copy of your resume so they remember you next time you call.
- Think of more questions in the meantime and don't let them forget about you!
