
DR. ORVILLE CLYDE WALZ

Orville C. Walz, fifth president of Concordia College, Edmonton, Alberta, graduated in 1961 from Concordia Teacher's College, Seward, where he was awarded the B.Sc. degree in Education. Continuing in graduate work, he received the Master's degree in Education from Moorhead State University in 1966, and Doctor of Education degree in 1972 from the University of Nebraska.

Dr. Walz brings a strong academic background and knowledge of administration to the presidency. From 1961-66 he was Principal, Organist, and Choir Director at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Perham, Minnesota. From 1966-69 he was Principal and Music Director at St. John's Lutheran Church, Young America, Minnesota. Since 1969 Dr. Walz has served at Concordia Teacher's College, Seward, Nebraska, as Assistant Registrar, Registrar, and prior to his election to the Presidency of Concordia College, Edmonton, he was Assistant Dean of Academic Affairs. During the 1980-81 academic year, whilst on sabbatical leave from CTC Seward, Dr. Walz enrolled in the Pastoral Colloquy Program at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis.

Dr. Walz was born in January 1939, in Yankton, South Dakota. Mrs. Walz, the former Marilyn Kielau, a graduate of Concordia, Edmonton, is a native of Middle Lake, Saskatchewan. They have two children, Tamra aged 16 who is enrolled in Grade 11 at Concordia, and Jeffrey aged 14, who attends Highlands Junior High School.

BRIEF HISTORY OF CONCORDIA COLLEGE

Concordia College was founded on October 31, 1921. Its original purpose was to prepare young men for the preaching and teaching ministries of The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod. In 1939, co-education, general courses of study, and an accredited high school program were introduced to broaden the purpose of the school. Since then, Concordia has operated as a two year college and accredited high school.

In 1967. Concordia was affiliated with the University of Alberta on the first year college level. In 1975, the affiliation was extended to include second year courses. In 1977, ownership and governance of the College was transferred to the two western Canadian districts of The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod.

Concordia has previously been served by four presidents: Dr. Albert H. Schwermann (1921-1954); Dr. Walter Wangerin (1954-1959); Rev. Roland Frantz (1960-1975); and Dr. Alfred R. Roth (1976-1980). Today marks the inauguration of Concordia College's fifth president, Dr. Orville C. Walz.

Concordia continues to offer programs to assist in the preparation of church workers. On campus, Concordia fosters a Christian lifestyle and encourages a dual commitment to academic excellence and religious vitality. The basic philosophy of the institution is espoused in the motto: "The Fear Of The Lord Is The Beginning Of Wisdom".
